I do hereby nominate & appoint this my last will and testament in manner and form as followeth
First- I will that all my just debts should be paid.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Henry Guy the tract of land whereon I now live including the plantation together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Henry Guy six negroes that is to say two negro fellows known by the names of Foster & Major one negro boy by the name of Frank one negro girl by the name of Lucy also a negro woman by the name of Beauty and her child Famer. the residue of property to be equally divided between my son William Henry Guy and my daughter Ann Eliza Holme.

Will of Charles Wilkinson

In the name of God Amen I Charles Wilkinson of Johnston Co of North Carolina being in health and of perfect sound sense and memory thanks be to God for the same and calling to mind the mortality of mankind that all is bound to die therefore of all my worldly goods which it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I give and bestow as follows first- I commit my soul to unto the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my executors and all my worldly debts to be paid and the remainder of my estate I give and bequeath as follows first-

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Wilkinson all the property she brought with her when I married her also all the bed clothing she has got to her bed since also all of my crop that I have growing or housed also one half of my hogs and eleven head of gear with all my dunghill goods I also lend to my beloved wife during her life or widowhood one hundred and eighty acres of land including the house and plantation where I now live also one horse creature saddle and bridle and four head of sheep one loom and gear one flax wheel one pair of cards one table one case of knives and forks one pot and spider and frying pan one axe one weeding hoe and one ploughhoe one washing tub one water pail and two piggins and two sitting chairs.

I also give and bequeath to my grandson Charles Wilkinson at the death or marriage of my wife the said land which I lend to my wife containing one hundred and eighty acres the residue of the land property I have to be equally divided between my three children to wit; Charity Aycock Penelope Bailey and Jesse Wilkinson I also give to my beloved daughter Charity Aycock one feather bed and furniture and all my stock of cattle and one three quart bottles. I also give to my daughter Penelope Bailey one feather bed and furniture and one half gallon bottle. I also give to my beloved son Jesse Wilkinson one hundred and fifty acres of land called Gims Ridge also one chest and all my wearing clothes and one decanter. I also give to my grand son Brantly Wilkinson two hundred and eighty acres of land called the Richardson place. I also give to my granddaughter Betsey Wilkinson

the bed and furniture whereon I usually lie I also leave the residue to be sold and equally divided between my three above named children.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my son-in-law Hardy Bailey and Hamilton Phillips to be my whole and sole executors and I do utterly revoke all former wills or wills by me made acknowledging this to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the thirteenth day of August 1828.
