In the name of God Amen I David Turner of Johnston County and the State of North Carolina being sick and weak in body but sound and perfect mind and memory do this thirty first day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following

1st I do hereby authorize and empower my executors & administrators to sell and dispose of any part of my estate either real or personal in such manner either for cash or on credit as they may think best for the purpose of paying my just debts.

2nd I do hereby constitute and appoint Bryan Smith and Thomas Price as executors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said David Turner have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written

Will of James Langley

In the name of God When I James Langley of the county of Johnston and State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this third day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following (Wt)

I give and bequeath to my beloved son Jacob Langley one hundred and twenty acres of land lying on Gumper Swamp including part of the plantation whereon I now live joining of Frances Langley's line and Joseph Boyett's my will is that there should be a line made from Gumper Swamp straight with the east side of the lane which runs through my plantation to be the line of said Jacobs land as above mentioned then so complement take wooding land joining the Joseph Boyett line.

I also give to my daughter Nancy Langley one hundred and twenty two acres of land including the remainder of my land. I also give to my daughter Sally Boyett one flat pewter dish four pewter plates two earthen plates one quart mug and one pint bowl. I also give to my daughter Dorcas Bass one pewter dish four pewter plates two earthen plates one quart mug and one pint Bowl. I also give to my daughter Mary Davis two small pewter dishes four pewter two earthen plates one quart mug and one pint bowl. And all my stock of cattle and sheep I desire should be sold and my just debts paid out of the money arising therefrom the balance if any to be equally divided between my children that is to say Sally Boyett, Mary Davis, Dorcas Bass, Jacob Langley and Nancy Langley. I also give to my son Isaac Langley two dollars and fifty cents. I also give to my son James Langley fifty cents. I also give to my daughter Elsie Langley fifty cents. I also give to my son Jesse Langley fifty cents. And all the remainder of my property of what kind or nature soever it be I give to my daughter Nancy Langley. And I do hereby constitute and appoint my true friends Holmf Sasser and my daughter Nancy Langley full and sole executors to this my last will and testament hereby revoking disannulling and making void all former wills and bequests by me made and declaring this only to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written witness
