Will of Davis Strickland,

In the name of God Amen I Davis Strickland of being sick of body but of a perfect and sound memory thanks be to God and falling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory world and knowing that it is appointed once that all men must die when it hath pleased God and that I commit my soul unto the hands of Almighty God who gave it. and I trust that all my sins are and may be forgiven through the blood and merits of Jesus Christ in hopes that my soul with my body shall rise again at a general resurrection and that for my worldly estate which it hath pleased God to bless me with for above my deserts may be ordered as followeth -

1st I will that my dear and loving wife Nancy shall have all my lands during her life or widowhood and after her decease I will that the said land or lands be given as followeth viz that is to say that it is my will that my son Benjamin Strickland shall have all my land over the Bay branch and I will that my son David Strickland shall have all the land on this side of said Bay branch and I will of either of above ears Benjamin or David should die before that they are in possession of the same that the surviving son shall possess and enjoy the whole property of the said land. I will that my daughter Abby Strickland shall have one feather bed and furniture. I will that my daughter Abby Strickland shall have one feather bed and furniture. I will that my daughter Sally Strickland shall have one feather bed and furniture I will that the aforesaid beds and furniture are not to be sold or moved not in eight years without that my aforesaid daughter should marry but that they shall remain in the family

for the use thereof. I will that all the rest of my property real and personal shall be to my loving wife Nancy Strickland as aforesaid during her natural life or widowhood and I will after my beloved wife's death or widowhood that this property may be sold to the best advantage and equally divided amongst my last five children (to wit) Moses Strickland Polly Strickland Levi Strickland Nancy Strickland Dizy Strickland and I will that this is my last will and testament in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal 12<sup>th</sup> day of October 1806 signed sealed and delivered in the presence of
