I recommend my soul to God who gave it to me and my body to the earth to be buried
or interred according to the direction of my Will To come I shall appoint hereafter

I will and bequeath to my brother Thomas Watson my new Suit of clothes Coat, jacket
& breeches my hat and silver cups

I will and bequeath to my brother James Watson a blue coat and a red jacket

I will and bequeath to my dear mother a red stuffer yeowling

I will and bequeath to my dearest beloved wife Elizabeth Watson my riding
horse bridle and saddle and one young horse and all my cattle and hogs
only them that is fit for sale

I will and bequeath to my child that my wife is big of if it a boy to be called
William after my name all my land for ever or if it is a girl for it to
inherit the same in the same manner only my wife to live on it all the
child comes at age boy or girl and all the rest of my personal estate
after my funeral expenses and just debts is paid all the rest of my estate
that is left to my wife hogs and cattle and all my house hold goods to
be equally divided between my wife and child only the hogs and cattle that
is fit for sale and further if my child should not live be it male or female
then my land I will and leave and bequeath to my brother John Watson and his
heirs forever, I will and bequeath my dearest beloved wife Elizabeth Watson my whole
and sole Executor along with my son Daniel James Watson as witnesses my hand
this 3^d day of September 1764

and I do hereby appoint my son in law Henry Johnson Executor of this my last
will and testament and I do hereby disannul all former wills by me

Ann Watkins 'Will'

10th Day of May 1802 Aaron Springs Needham Godwin Came before me Exults Court Justice for Johnston County and made oath that of the 4th of May 1803 Ann Watkins of Johnston County, Cried on them to be witnesses how she would give the free part of her estate

Aaron Springs and Needham Godwin did say before me as follows that Ann Watkins gave to her two daughters Peggy Watkins and Anna Watkins Ten Horse named Bucks one Cow and calf to each of them two head of oxen to each of them and half his hogs to them got over she lent her frame horse furniture to them as long as they live single and she lent her land and plantation to them both as long as they both are single

She gave to her son Allen Watkins his bed and furniture

She gave to her son Willie Watkins, Allen Watkins and Anna Watkins all the remaining part of her estate to be divided between them

She gave her share to James Watkins son of Allen Watkins

Jacob Watsons 'Will'

In the name of God Amen - I Jacob Watson of Johnston County being in proper sense of mind do hereby make this my last will and testament as follows
I give to my son Jekie my Smith tools and rifle Gun and seven head of hogs - I give to my son Salomon my cows and other Gun - I give to my daughter Ann my horse and four head of cattle - I give to my son Simon three head of cattle and three head of sheep - I give to my daughter her share four head of sheep - I give to my daughter Mary four head of cattle and the rest and residue of my goods and chattels and personal estate after the payment of my debts legacies and funeral expenses and unto my wife Elizabeth whom I make sole executrix of this my last will and testament - I give to my wife and bequeath to her and her heirs all and every my messuages whosoever and wheresover which I also charge with payment of my said legacies In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 18th Day of April in the year of our Lord 1773. Signed published and declared by the above named Jacob Watson for and as his last will and testament in the presence of us

Wall I give and bequeath him one Cow and be to be his wife my second love then sold and the rest to his part as for as it goes sell the rest and buy the debts and then divide the rest of the money to be worn my children I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend Jesse Wall senior and Wm. Orby London Executors of this my last will and testament I witness whereof I the said Perry Wall had to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the Day and year before written
