

Will of Edmond Smith -

In the Name of God Amen - Twenty Third day of February in the year of our Lord 1760 - I Edmond Smith in the County of Johnston Planter being very sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament and desire it may be taken by all as such, and first of all I give and bequeath my soul unto the hands of God, that gave it and for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the direction of my executors touching but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me in this life. I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form. Imprimis I give and bequeath eldest son Ezekiel Smith his heirs and assigns forever one parcel of land containing Ninety acres situate in the upper part of the land lying in the bend of the River together with the Plantation formerly belonging to Thomas Bullard.

Item I desire that Thomas Bullard and his present wife may have their life times each on the said Plantation  
Item I give and bequeath to my son John Smith the lower part of the aforesaid tract of Land containing Ninety acres to him and his heirs and assigns forever together with the Plantation whereon I now live. I also desire that the division of this tract of land may begin at the old marsh & over wood corner tree between Watsons and Bullard and out by Bennetts old field so as to the outside line on the Duck Pond.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Smith a parcel of land containing One hundred acres lying on the south side of Little River to be and to remain to him his heirs and assigns forever

Item I give unto my daughter Delilah Smith her heirs and assigns forever One hundred acres of land lying on the south side of this River

Item I give to my beloved wife Mary all the remainder of my Estate after the payment of my debts whom I constitute and make executor together with Thomas Bullard sole Executor of this my last will and testament and I do here by sign my hand and seal the day and

and all other former testaments and wills and legacies bequeathed and Executed by me in any ways before this time named. Ratifying this and no other to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.
