

Will of Elizabeth Dodd,

In the name of God Amen I Elizabeth Dodd of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina, being in a law state of health but of sound and perfect mind and memory for which I am thankful to Almighty God I do hereby make and order this to be my last will and testament in the following manner (to wit)

Item First I give and bequeath to my son Reuben Dodd all my crop of corn and fodder my cotton and potatoes and brandy also seven chairs one chest one table and one earthen pitcher and my wheat to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Jenny Sweeney my riding saddle to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Dice Carter saddle cloth to her and her heirs forever. It is my further will and desire that all the remaining part of my property be sold by my executors herein after named at six months credit and the money arising therefrom together with the debts due me to be equally divided among my children (to wit) John Dodd, Dunphy Dodd, William Dodd, Bennett Dodd, Reuben Dodd, Jenny Sweeney, Elizabeth Dodd, Duckee Windham and Dice Carter to them and their heirs forever.

And I lastly I do hereby constitute make and ordain my sons Bennett Dodd and Reuben Dodd executors to this my last will and testament ratifying this and only this to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of September A. D. 1814. Signed sealed published and declared

Will of Edmund Crumpler.

In the name of God Amen. The first day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirteen I Edmund Crumpler of Johnston County and State of North Carolina being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God and calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die I therefore make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say in manner and form following.

First of all I leave the debts due me to be collected by my executors hereafter named and payment to be made of all my just debts lawfully appearing and the surplus of said money I dispose of with the remainder of my estate in manner and form following.

I give or lend to my loving friend Vines Morris all my property of every kind and nature both real and personal to her and her use and benefit during the time she continues in a single life and after her death a marriage to any man whatever I give and bequeath my aforesaid estate to the two daughters born of the body of said Vines Morris to be equally divided between the two girls Anna and Patsy Morris to them and their heirs and assigns forever and I also constitute and appoint my loving friend Vines Morris my executors of this my last will and testament revoking and disannulling all and every other will or executor whatever satisfying this and none other to be my last will and testament which I confirm in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the day and year above written
