In the name of God Amen, I Sarah Carroll being weak in body but of good memory do make and ordain this as my last will and testament that is to say I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lacey Johnson one mare called Poll saddle and bridle.

Then I give unto my son Caleb Penny three negroes namely Toby, Lydia and her youngest child Boston, also I give him field of corn fodder (and potato) &c where the potato patch is in over next to Mr R. Sanders also the potatoes, also one gray horse all this and these to him and his heirs forever after their legacies are taken out - the balance of my property or estate to my will and desire that it should be equally divided between all my children namely Alexander Penny, Ann Atkins, Isaac Penny, Easter Sturdivant, Hardy Penny, James Penny, Frances Atkins Lacey, Johnson, Sally Penny and Caleb Penny to them and their heirs forever and I do wish and devise that Mr Ruben Sanders and Hardy Penny act as executors to this my last will and testament. August 26th 1812

Will of Edward Waddell

State of North Carolina, Johnston County.

In the name of God Amen, I Edward Waddell am in proper health thanks be to God and calling to mind the immortality of my body knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this as my last will and testament that is to say first of all I give my soul into the hands of God who gave it and my body to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my executors and as touching my worldly estate which God hath blessed me with in this life I give and devise and dispose of in the following manner and form,

I lend to my beloved wife Polly Waddell her lifetime or widowhood the plantation wherein I now live and the Pate plantation and land belonging to it all the households goods and working tools and three head of horses and saddle and two cows and calves and fifteen head of hogs and all the sheep.

I give to my son William Waddell ten shillings.

I give to my son Richard Waddell one hundred and sixty dollars if having any child after our death.

I give to my son Everett Waddell two hundred and ten acres of land more or less being on the north side of Hooten branch.

I give to my son Joel Waddell two hundred acres of land lying in the fork of Juniper Swamp and Jacobs branch including the Parrish place one heifer one feather bed and sow and pigs

I give to my daughter Rhoda Pearce one pot one heifer.

I give to my daughter Gilphie Hoales one pot one heifer one robben wheel

I give to my son John Waddell two hundred acres of land more or less including the Pate place one heifer one pot one colt by name of Prince.

I give to my son Edward Waddell two hundred and fifty acres of land more or less the plantation wherein I now live down to the county line one feather bed I now lie on one colt by the name of Spank

one dutch oven and spider and all the pewter and all my barrells and hoops one heifer

The other part of my estate which is not given away in legacies to be sold to pay my debts and what remains to be equally divided between John and Edward

Also I make and order David Barnes and my son Joe Waddell to be my only and sole executors of this my last will and testament and I do utterly and disannull all and every other will and testament or legacies by me bequeathed. Ratifying confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have unto set my hand and seal this the 20 day of April 1812 signed sealed and acknowledged in the presence of us and in the presence of each other

Will of William Carrell

Georgia

In the name of God Amen I William Carrell of the State of North Carolina and Johnston County feeling and indisposition of body but of perfect sound mind and memory thanks be to God for calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament As touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

First

I give and bequeath to Sarah my dearly beloved wife all that part of my estate that now exist in the State of N. Carolina and Johnston County at the present place of my residence which I received with or acquired by or in virtue of my marriage with said Sarah consisting of personal property (viz) three negroes Toby and his wife Liddy and her child, Liddy

A small stock of horses and cattle &c. The residue of my property at the said place of my residence I desire that it should be sold and the money equally divided amongst all my children whom I shall hereafter mention if any there is after all lawful expences paid.

Also I give to my daughter Mary & William Hunt three hundred dollars cash to be raised out my estate

Also I give to my daughter Bethania & Edward Prather three hundred dollars cash.

I also give to my grandchildren the orphans of my son John Carrell deceased two hundred dollars cash to be equally divided amongst them when they come of age.

I give to the lawful issues or issue of my son Mitchell Carrell and Sarah his wife my negro George and seven cows and calves and two feather beds one with furniture and one without the said Mitchell to have the use of the above mentioned property but not to dispose of it in any manner whatever and five hundred dollars to be paid to said issue or issues when of age
