

James Durham's Will

In the Name of God Amen - I James Durham of Johnston and Province of North Carolina being sick and weak in body but of perfect sense and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say Principally and first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it as for my body I Commit it to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors and Exors but my wishing my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with I desire that it in the following manner Viz. in the first place I desire that my just debts and general charges be paid which I desire that my Executors and Exors hereinafter named sell as much of the movable estate and stock as they shall see proper to satisfy my debts and of general charges as before mentioned.

My daughter Margret she not behaving her self as a dutiful child ought to so I give her Ten shillings Present and no more

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Elizabeth one side saddle and bridle and one mare called Macborough and her cart harness and all the rest of my estate Real and Personal I lend to her during her life time or widowhood.

I give to my daughter Mary Ten pounds One - money -

I will that after the decease or widowhood of my wife I give and bequeath unto my son William all the rest of my estate real and Personal lands and ornaments to him and his heirs forever but in case he should die before he comes of age or having any lawful issues then my estate above mentioned to be disposed of as follows. The three old negroes Named Tony, Prince and Nance to be sold at Public vendue and the money arising from such sale be equally divided between my three grand children namely Ales Arter, Nancy Arter and Hannah Arter and also three young negro girls One called Hannah to Ales Arter One called Tommy to Nancy Arter and one called James to Hannah Arter and one negro boy called Sam I give unto my grand daughter Mary Lawson and the land and the Plantation wherupon I now live I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Hannah Arter and after the above legacies all the balance of the remainder part of my estate to be equally divided between my three grand children above named Ales Arter Nancy Arter and Hannah Arter and also I will and desire that my son William be under the protection of his mother till he comes of age in case she should die before he comes of age it is my will that Benjamin Rutcliff and Jane his wife take him into their care till he comes of age but in case they both die leave him to Agnes Hensel or some said and it is my will that if of which the above named persons he falls in case of give him sufficient schooling out of the interest of the estate

In the name of God Amen, the 20th day of January 1770 - I Emanuel Dees of the County of Johnston in the Province of North Carolina being sick of body but of perfect memory thanks be to God and calling to remembrance the uncertainty of this life do make constitute and ordain this my last will and testament hereby disannulling all others heretofore by me made either by word or writing and this is only to be read in manner and form following, that is to say first giving up my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named

I lend the manner house and half the orchard and clew ground to my well beloved wife Elizabeth during her life

I give and bequeath to my loving son Daniel my plantation with all my land

I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Dorsey Dees two pounds

I give and bequeath to my beloved son David Dees forty shillings

I give and bequeath to my loving daughter Sarah Benton ten shillings

I give and bequeath to my loving daughter Priscilla Hatcher ten shillings

I give and bequeath to my loving daughter Susan being two cows and calves and my will and desire is that all my just debts and all the just debts that shes owing my son in law to wit to John Smith make and to Samuel Smith his brother be paid and satisfy out of the money now in my house and live wise all my general expenses and the remainder part if any to the use of my wife and son Daniel.

I give and bequeath to my well beloved grand daughter Ales Hatcher one quarter of an Acre and Furniture

I give to my loving friend Robert Hatcher five shillings

I lend all the remainder part of my estate to my well beloved wife Elizabeth Dees during her life and after her decease to be equally divided between

Impressa I will and bequeath to my brother Thomas Watson my new Suit of clothes Coat, jacket
& breeches my hat and silk caps

Item I will and bequeath to my brother James Watson a blue coat and a red jacket

Item I will and bequeath to my dear mother a red Steeple yeowling

Impressa I will and bequeath to my dearest beloved wife Elizabeth Watson my riding
horse bridle and saddle and one young horse and all my cattle and hogs
only them that is fit for sale

Item I will and bequeath to my child that my wife is big of if it a boy to be called
William after my name all my land for ever or if it is a girl for it to
inherit the same in the same manner only my wife to live on it all the
child comes at age boy or girl and all the rest of my personal estate
after my funeral expenses and just debts is paid all the rest of my estate
that is left to my wife hogs and cattle and all my house hold goods to
be equally divided between my wife and child only the hogs and cattle that
is fit for sale and further if my child should not live be it male or female
then my land I will and leave and bequeath to my brother John Watson and his
heirs forever, I will and bequeath my dearest beloved wife Elizabeth Watson my stock
and sole executrix along with my daughter James Watson as witnesses my hand
this 3^d day of September 1764

Amy Joiner, Debby Johnson, Nathaniel West Patience Maurice I shall have
and I do hereby appoint my son in law Henry Johnson Executor of this my last
will and testament and I do hereby disannul all former wills by me
