 branch to said river being all my lands on the north side of  
 said river below said branch containing about six hundred acres  
 also one other tract lying on the south side of said river  
 a small distance above my mills adjoining the lands of William  
 Johnston and Amos Watkins containing two hundred acres more or  
 less also one acre of land lying on south side of said river  
 where the mills now stand which was laid off for the use  
 of said mills also my boat in Neuse River and also such
