In the name of God Amen - I Gregory Colley of the County of Johnson and Parc
of St. Stephen being very sick and weak but of perfect mind and memory calling
to mind how is appointed for all men once to die - I record my will to God
who gave it to me and my body to be buried after a Christian manner in the
discretion of my Executors whom I shall mention hereafter in this paper
I give and bequeath to my son John my Gray Horse name Prince and four
head of cattle

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary five head of cattle and it is my
will and I do bequeath to my dear beloved wife, Rachel Colley
my plantation I now live on during her life and it is my will that
after her decease that the lands should be equally divided between my
two sons John and Charles.

I give and bequeath to my dear beloved wife Rachel Colley seven head
of cattle and eleven pounds and a half of Pewter and my young mare
named Peacock and it is my will that my son Charles shall have
the first call that she brings.

I give and bequeath to my dear beloved wife Rachel Colley five head of sheep
and it is my will that all my old traps that is yet for morrow
to be sold to take out a debt for my land and to pay all my just debts and
it is my will that the remainder of my Pewter to be divided between my
three children John, Charles and Mary and the remainder of my sheep like
wife and one for

I give and bequeath to my son Charles four head of cattle.

I give and bequeath to my son John my writing saddle

I give and bequeath to my dear beloved wife Rachel Colley the Rent of
my estate that I have not willed away after my just debts are paid
and funeral expenses as a legacy and I do appoint and constitute
my wife Rachel Colley my Executor in full and my son John Colley
with her this my last will and testament avowing all acts made
before as witness my hand and seal this 25th day of November
Anno Domini 1762 - Signed, sealed and delivered in the presence of us

to him and his heirs forever

I also lend to my well beloved wife as you will all my real and
personal estate during her natural life and after her decease to be equally
divided amongst all my children but desire that she may sell as
much of the perishable estate as she shall think fit.

I do also appoint my beloved wife as overseer my soul and body excepting
of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills
by me made & sealing this and no other to be my last will and
testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the day and year above written signed sealed and delivered in the
presence of us
