

Will of Hardy Hinton

In the name of God Amen I Hardy Hinton of the County of Johnston
and Parish of St Stephen being through the abundance of Mercy of god holden
in body yet of perfect understanding and memory do constitute this my
last will and testament and desire it may be recorded by all such persons
I give my body to the earth from whence it was taken in full assurance of
its resurrection hence at the last day, as for my soul I desire it may
be at the discretion of my executors hereafter named with my dear wife.

I positively order that all my debt may be paid
I will and bequeath to my son Mallacia Hinton one negro boy called Peter
with the cattle he holds of possession with his riding horse one mare
and two colts with what house hold good he has in his possession I will
by him to my son Hardy Hinton One Negro boy named Lusk with seven
cows and calves with two young horses one mare and colt and one
pig and furniture

I will and bequeath to my son Domacy Hinton two Negro boys named
Sam and the other Tom and store with one bed and furniture with all
the stock of cattle in possession of James Moore upon stock

I will and bequeath to my son Willie one Negro boy Peter
Juby with one bed and furniture

I will to my son John One negro girl called Venus to have
when she comes of age of twenty one with her grace after leaves
from of my dearly beloved wife

I leave and will to my son Palmon a negro girl called
Mall Hinton I will and leave to my son Job and William
the plantation with her decree of my wife or if Job comes of
age before her decease for my executors to divide said land and
plantation Hinton I will and bequeath to my well beloved
daughter Febby Hinton one negro boy called Pompey and one
negro girl called Nellie all the legacies left to all my
children and their heirs forever and if any of them dies
without heirs their estate to be equally divided between each
brother and after my funeral expenses be paid I leave all
the rest of my estate at the disposal of my dearest beloved
wife Mary Hinton whom I have along with my brother
William Hinton as my whole & sole Executress of this my last Will and
Testament revoking all others. In witness I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this 18th day of August AD 1760 Interlined before
assigned

North Carolina & October AD 1760
Johnston County & before his Magistrate

Will of Lawson Washington

In the name of God Amen

This the 15th day of January in the year of our Lord God 1761 - I Lawson Washington in Johnston in North Carolina being very sick and weak in body
but in perfect mind and memory, chaunes to give to almighty God
herefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it
is appainent for all men once to die I do make this my last will
and testament thuts to day first and principally I recommend my soul
into the hands of the Almighty God that gave it and to my body I recom-
end to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the
direction of my Executor nothing doubting but the resurrection I
shall receive the same again by the almighty power of god and
as touching such things, as it has pleased god to bless me in this
world with. I give somes dispoz of in the following manner
and form

Myself I give and bequeath to Thomas Fair my wife and beloved
friend ten hogs four barrows and six cows, a gray mare and
three barrels of Orr money lye and a dish six wooden plates two
wooden dishes ten spoons and a new spoon and a new fork and a
drawing knife one fork and a bed a pot and a pot and
fork tools and a hanging iron, a pair of compasses and pens
more less a round shore copper at Coopers tapers etc three
hangings iron brams few more or less from brams more or
less a sow and a whale and all and every thing that I
am now possessed with - I also constue and appoint
my loving friend Thomas Fair my lawfull executor of this
my last will and testament and all and singular to the
in said property by him and I do hereby utterly desre void
and revoke all and any other testament and wills and
legacies and bequeathments execution by me in any wise
before mention or named or named in or wills and bequeathed
rate first and to confirm this to be my last will and testament
and no other witness wherefore I set my hand and seal this

15th Day of January 1761
