Item I give and bequeath unto the heirs lawfully begotten at present or hereafter of the body of my beloved daughter Patience Stevens all and singular the aforesaid lands but as aforesaid to be by them possessed from and immediately after the death of those to whom the same are lent as aforesaid to them and their heirs forever also the whole of the aforesaid negroes and my estate of every kind or nature whatsoever not disposed of otherwise by this will to be by them possessed as aforesaid and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son-in-law Jacob Stevens and my friend Reuben Sanders executors to this my last will and testament revoking all other or former wills by me in anywise heretofore made Ratifying and confirming this will only this to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the eleventh day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight-hundred and seven. Will of Henry Johnson Jr

In the name of God Amen I Henry Johnson Jr of the County of Johnston in the State of North Carolina being in a low state of health but of perfect and sound mind and memory for which I am truly thankful to Almighty God do this the eleventh day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight-and-sevens make and ordain this my last will and testament as follows (to wit)

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Drury Johnson the following negroes (to wit) Andrew, Patience and Wimpy to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Penruha Barber the following negroes (to wit) Skipper, Fillas and Randy to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Douilla Date three negroes named Tempy, Davie and Queen to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Patsey Johnson one tract of land containing about three hundred acres lying on the south side of Marsh branch adjoining the lands of Drury Johnson and others, one negro girl named Penny to her and her heirs forever and also one bay mare called Duke and it is further my will and desire after the payment of my just debts, that my property of every kind not before willed be equally divided between my wife and all my surviving children and not to the representatives or representatives of my deceased child or children. I hereby constitute and appoint my son Drury Johnson my sole executor of this my last will and testament hereby making null and void all other aforesaid wills or testaments by me heretofore made & declaring this and only this to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I the said Henry Johnson do have hereunto set my hand and seal the date above written signed sealed published and declared by the said testator to be his last will and testament in presence of.
