In the name of God Amen I Gilbert Starling now in <sup>sound and</sup> perfect  
 memory thanks be to God for it do make my last will and  
 testament in the fear of God, first I do give unto my beloved  
 wife one gray mare and two cows and calves and one heifer, suppose  
 to be with calf and three hat of hogs and all the land in  
 my possession I do further give unto my beloved wife her lifetime  
 a widowhood two feather beds and bedsteads and furniture and  
 as much of the kitchen furniture as my wife sees her to  
 keep and I do further give to my beloved wife fifteen barrels  
 of corn and all the shecks that comes of one the past year  
 belonging to me and one Male stake and one top stake the  
 above named property I do give unto my beloved wife during  
 her lifetime or widowhood and I do leave Stephen Barnes  
 and Levey Galoin my executors and trusty friends to settle my  
 business the balance of my property that I have not named  
 I wish to be sold and equally divided between my children  
 this 18<sup>th</sup> of September 1817 witness my hand and seal.

## Will of Robert Gully

In the name of God Amen I Robert Gully of Johnston  
 County in the State of North Carolina being but weak in  
 body yet of sound mind and memory blessed be God for the same  
 do this twenty eighth day of April in the year of our Lord one  
 thousand eight hundred and five make ordain and declare  
 this instrument of writing to be and contain my last will  
 and testament in manner and form following,

Item I lend to my beloved wife for and during the term of her  
 life or widowhood the house wherein I now dwell including  
 all my lands except the land lying on the west side of  
 the old mill creek also my grist mill also my negro fellows  
 Cain and Scott for life or widowhood also my negro girl Tiner  
 for and during the term of her natural life

Item I give to my wife two feather beds and furniture and one half  
 of my other household good and kitchen bed excepted and one  
 half horse and half of my plantation tool and one third  
 part of my cattle, hogs, sheep and geese.

Item I give to my son John Gully son of William Gully of Duplin  
 County one horse and my selling saddle the remaining part  
 of my beds and furniture horses and the one half of my  
 household and kitchen furniture plantations tools and one  
 third part of my cattle hogs sheep and geese and my negro  
 wench Hannah and one negro named Will I leave to be sold  
 by my executors on six month credit and the money arising  
 from the sale thereof after paying my debts if any with  
 the money due me to be divided as follows to John Gully  
 son of John Gully one third part the other two thirds  
 I leave to be equally divided between Nathan Gully George  
 Gully and Robert Gully sons of said John Gully dec<sup>d</sup>

Item I give to my nephew Robert Gully son of John Gully  
 dec<sup>d</sup> his heirs and assigns forever after the marriage or death  
 of my wife all my lands including the houses wherein  
 I now dwell my grist mill and the land I bought of Deunis  
 Condy also my negro Scott and Jim. A. B. the land bought of  
 Deunis Condy I leave to be rented out by my executor for  
 his own use until the death or marriage of my wife and I  
 do hereby appoint my said nephew Robert Gully executor  
 of this my last will and testament. in witness whereof the  
 said Robert Gully have hereunto set my hand and
