Will of John Eason

In the name of God Amen I John Eason of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being in a low state of health but in perfect mind and senses do make this my last will and testament - first I give and bequeath to my beloved wife — Eason the plantation whereon I now live and the one the other side of the bridge adjoining the creek during her natural life or widowhood and also three negroes known by name of Joe, Judy and Lott also a sufficient quantity of household and kitchen furniture to be laid of by my after named executors in the second place I give to my three Sons John, Henry and Thomas Eason all my lands lying on the waters of Middle Creek or on the creek and all my other land to be sold and the money divided between my daughters Sally Whittington, Temperance Eason Harriet Eason I wish all the hands to stay together this year and then hired out until the heirs comes of age each heir may draw their part as soon as they come of age I wish my wife to have a sufficiency of cattle stock and two bedsteads of as before mentioned at the end of twelve months I wish all the residue of my property sold except what shall be allotted my wife and equally divided between my children lastly I appoint my trusty friends Henry Bryan and James Vinson executors to this my last will and testament.

Will of Isaac Gerald

North Carolina Johnston County In the name of God Amen I Isaac Gerald of Johnston County being very sick and weak in health of body but of perfect sound mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed once for all men to die do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament - that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

First I lend my negro by the name of Isaac to my beloved wife during the plantation wherein I now live and half the land that I possess during her natural life also I give and bequeath to my beloved Mary one horse saddle and saddle and two plow hoes and two plows and gees and two weeding hoes and one feather bed and furniture and all my hogs and all my cattle and half my sheep and my geese and one trunk and all my pewter and my horn, wheel and cards and chains to her and her heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Delany Hall ten shillings to her and her heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my beloved son Enos Gerald one cross cut saw and two augurs, two chisels, one hand saw and drawing knife and taper bit one adze and after the decease of my wife I give the above lent negro boy Isaac to my son Enos Gerald to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Matilda Wilkerson one feather bed and furniture and I give to beloved daughter Matilda Wilkerson one half of the land that I now possess to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Miriam Gerald after the decease of my wife I give to my daughter Miriam Gerald the other half of my land including the plantation that I now live on to her and her heirs forever also I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Miriam Gerald one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

and all the rest part of my estate that is not above mentioned to be sold and after my worldly debts are paid and twenty dollars in money paid to my wife Mary Gerald

the rest to be equally divided between my three children
 Enos Gerald Montelby Wilkinson and Meiram Gerald and I
 do hereby appoint and constitute Enos Gerald and Abraham
 Batten my two trusty friends executors to this my last
 will and testament and I do hereby disallow smoke and disannull
 all and every other former testaments wills Legacies and
 bequests whatever ratifying and confirming this and no other
 to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal the 19th day of March 1815

Item I give to my sister Cecily Sasser one shilling.

Item I give to my sister Penny Sasser one shilling.

Item I give to my sister Beady Sasser one shilling and all
 the residue or remaining of my property or estate of
 whatsoever kind it be I give to my chosen Liliby Sasser.

And I hereby make and ordain my worthy friends Henry Sasser
 and Joseph Boyett executors of this my last will and testament
 in witness whereof I the said Edith Sasser have to this my
 last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and
 year above written Signed sealed published and delivered by
 the said Edith Sasser the testator as her last will and
 testament in the presence of us who were present at the
 time of signing and sealing thereof.
