

Will of Jacob Duck

In the name of God Amen, November the 19th day
in the year of our Lord Christ 1794. I Jacob Duck of the
County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being at
the time in a low situation of health but in my per-
serves thanks be to God for it therefore calling to mind
the estate and mortality of my body and knowing that
it is appointed for all men to die I do constitute make
and ordain this my last will and testament that is to
say personally and first of all after this life ended
I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of God that gave
it and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian and
decent like manner at the discretion of my executors here-
after mentioned nothing doubting but at the last general
reverction I shall receive the same by the mighty power
of God and as to such worldly estate wherewithal it hath
pleased God to bless me with in this life I dispose in
the following manner that is to say

To my beloved wife Anna
Duck I give and bequeath one bedstead bed and furniture
five sets and eighteen pieces to be hers forever and two hundred
acres of land including the plantation wherein we now live
during her life or widowhood also two Pots and hooks four
pewter plates two pewter basins one dish and nine spoons
during her life or widowhood.

To my living son John Duck I give
two negro boys the one named Jim and the other Lumpkin
one smooth iron gun, one pair ofsmith bellows tongs and stile

To my living daughter Lydia I give one negro woman named
Sinha with this observe that the first living child of
the said Anna has to belong to my daughter Penny and
the next living child to belong to my daughter Beady also
one bed and bedstead.

To my living daughter Mary Duck I give one negro boy
marked Sillas observing this that if the said Mary dies with-
out and heir the abid negro Sillas to be sold and the money
he purchases to be divided among the rest four oldest daughters
To my daughters Penny Duck and Beady Duck each of them
a cow and yearling oxen and a feather bed to be equally divided
between them To my daughter Miller I give ten shillings
To my son James I give ten shillings To my daughter Eliz-

abeth I give ten shillings I also give all that is coming
to me by heirsip to my wife Sarah Duck and her children
also to my daughter Penny Duck one mare bridle and
saddle likewise to my daughter Beady Duck two cows
and yearlings and two hieffers more as to the rest of my
property that is not yet mentioned before also two hundred
acres of land to be sold and the money obtained by the
sale of same to be put to the use of paying my debts
and if any remainder after such payment such remainder
to be equally divided among my children I also make and
constitute my son John Duck also my friend James Rountree
my whole and sole executors of this my last will and testa-
ment and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul
and every other testament will and legacies or executors by
me in any wise before this time named ratifying and confirm-
ing this and no other to be my last will and testament
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the day and year above written signed sealed and delivered
by the said Jacob Duck as his last will and testament
in presence of us
