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on scale in the fund as shall make them equal in proportion as their respective amounts may be to the fund for their use.

I further will and desire of my executors that - they may enclose over my grave suitable monument and that - they may enclose the same as well as the grave of my dear Willie in a permanent and durable manner.

And I do here affix and designate as my executors to the my last will and testament my truly friends Nathan Williams, Bythan Bryan and Hiram H. Husted who I hope & do faithfully trust will see this my last will and desire carried into full effect - and as near the meaning and plain intent thereof as may be possible according to a provisior.

Thus having disposed of all my worldly attainments - as herein pleaseth me at the time and date hereof and in and by which I have given unto my wife such a share or more as the law would allow her and all ample and sufficient for her comfort and independance during life and I hope a all is so plainly directed that - there will be no need of dispute or controversies over or about it.

In the name of God Amen I Jacob Woodall Sr of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being of sound disposing mind and memory do the 23rd day of November A.D. 1848 make publick and declare my last will and testament in form and manner following (to wit)

Item 1st I give to my son William one negro man by the name of Sam and one negro girl by the name of Spicy to him and his heirs forever

Item 2nd I give to my daughter Cinderilla one negro man by the name of Joe and one negro girl by the name of Avery to her and her heirs forever

Item 3rd I give to my son James G. one negro boy named Arthur and one negro woman by the name of Silver together with her increase to him and his heirs forever

Item 4th I lend to my daughter Charitina her natural one negro girl by the name of Rachel and after her death it is my will that - the said Rachel be given to her lawful children to them and their heirs forever.

Item 5th I lend to my beloved wife Lucy one negro man named Atlas and one negro woman by the name of Sook for and during the term of her natural life and after her death it is my will that - the aforesaid negro be sold and the monies arising from such sale be equally divided in the following manner to wit - to my son William one fourth part, to my daughter Cinderilla one fourth part - to my son James G. one fourth part & to the lawful children of my daughter Charitina one fourth part to them and their heirs forever.

Item 6th I lend to my beloved wife Lucy during her natural life two feather beds together with their necessary furniture one chest, one Table, sofa - one set of cups & saucers, two earthen dishes and one Pewter dish six Pewter plates, one jug, two glass bottles one case of knives and forks six earthen plates six spoons one coffee pot one sugar dish one earthen pitcher six earthen bowls two Pewter basins two mugs two Pots two pair of pot hooks 1 spider 1 skillet 1 room & gear and flap wheel one wooden wheel 1 pair of cott

cards one pair of wooden cards one set of water cans
 six sitting chairs, one bible, testament and hymn book eight Item 10
 cider barrels one cider hogshead one open head hogshead
 one bread tray and meal sifter one wooden bowl one
 meal barrel one far one spice barrel one pepper box
 one horse and horse bell two cows and calves and one
 cow bell five head of sheep and one sheep bell, eight day
 hogs two pens and pigs two cotton plows one dozen plows
 one set of plow gear one plow stock two club axes two
 grubbing hoes two weeding hoes one iron wedge one drawing
 knife one hand saw two augers two chisels one gimlet
 one claw hammer one horse cart one bridle & saddle

Item 7th It is my will that - my wife shall have choice and
 after her death it - is my will that - all the articles above
 mentioned - that remains free from wear or waste be sold (by
 executors herein after named) at public sale and the
 monies arising from such sale to be equally divided between
 my four children to wit - William, Cinderella, James G.
 and Charity - to them and their heirs forever.

Item 8th I give to my beloved wife Lucy out of the clock
 crop and provisions on hand a plentiful support for
 herself and family for one year and if there be any
 insufficiency and equivalent in money as shall make
 a plentiful support for herself and family for the term
 of one year.

Item 9th I lend to my wife Lucy during her natural life
 the plantation whereon I now live together with my
 lands and plantation not above disposed of and after
 her death it - is my will that - the tract of land
 whereon I now live containing about three hundred
 and twelve acres be equally divided between the law-
 ful children of my daughter Charity - the survivor
 or survivors of them to them and their heirs forever
 the residue of lands loaned in the above item being
 about two hundred and thirty acres which includes
 my upper plantation I dispose of it as follows. To
 wit - after the death of my wife I give the said
 two hundred and thirty-two acres to my daughter

Cinderella to her and her heirs forever.
 It is my will that - the residue of my property not
 disposed of nor enumerated in the above items be sold
 after my death at public sale by my executor hereafter
 (named) to be appointed and all the debts due me
