

James Farmer Will

In the name of God Amen the first day of June in the year of our Lord 1756 I James Farmer of the County of Johnston and Province of North Carolina being very sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory have to god therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body but of perfect mind knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and to be my last will to say so incapable and first of all I give and recommend my body into the hands of God that gave it and for my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a Christian and decent manner at the discretion of my executors Nothing doubting true the general resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estates where with it hath pleased almighty God to bless me with in this life I give devise and dispose of the manner and form following

In p- It is my will and I do order that in the first place all my just debts to paid and satisfied

I leave the plantation wherein I now live with one hundred acres of land to my well beloved wife during her natural life on the said side of Neuse River

I give to my son John Farmer One hundred acres of land on the north side Neuse River and adjoining Red Cutlers corner at the beginning running on the said line ^{thence} across the said river to him and his heirs forever

I give to my son James Farmer One hundred acres of land lying on the north side Neuse river Beginning at a Hickory on the said River then running to Red Cutlers line thence down the said line and then to the river for complement to him and his heirs forever

I give to my son Enoch Farmer One hundred acres of land lying on the North side Neuse River being part of the same survey before mentioned to him and his heirs forever

I give my son Asa Bell One hundred acres of land lying on the north side Neuse River the corner end of the said tract land to him and his heirs forever

I give my son Benjamin Farmer One hundred acres of land beginning at James Farmers line to adjoining John Farmers cross line and running down said line then across the said line for complement to him and his heirs forever

I give to my son Niss Farmer One hundred acres of land lying on the North side of Neuse River it being a part of a tract granted to James Farmer adjoining Benjamin Farmers & being the lower end of the said tract of land to him and his heirs forever

I give to my well beloved wife One horse named Drosoker and one horse named Daity and one mare named Pleasure to her and her heirs forever

I give to my son John Farmer one bay mare with her increase all ready received to him and his heirs forever

I give to my son James Farmer one dark bay mare with her increase all ready received to him and his heirs forever

I give to my son Enoch Farmer one bright bay mare with a blaze in her face and all her increase to him and his heirs forever

I give to my son Benjamin Farmer One bright bay mare and all and all her increase to him and his heirs forever

I give to my son Niss Farmer one black mare named Charney with her increase to him and his heirs forever

I give to my son Asa Bell one black mare named Flowers and her increase to him and his heirs forever

I give my son William one dark colored horse named Dolphin or the value in money to him and his heirs forever

I give to my daughter Mary Farmer one bay horse with a star in his face or the value of the said horse in money to her and her heirs forever

I give to my Daughter Sarah Farmer One horse or the value in money to her and her heirs forever

I give my well and beloved wife Seven cows and calves to her and her heirs forever

I give all the rest of my estate to be equally divided among my children by John Smith Junr and Benj Pateff

I give to my well beloved wife her first choice of a bed and my son John his second choice of a bed and the other two beds with their furniture to her and her heirs forever

I give to my son John Farmer One Ruffle barrel to him and his heirs forever

I give to my son James Farmer one Smale gun to him and his heirs forever

I give my son Thomas Farmer one Ruffle gun to him and his heirs forever

My desire is here may be a sufficiency of food for the family over the ensuing year

It is my desire that all my merchantable traps be sold and my debts satisfied out of that money and after my debts paid I desire the overplus to be equally divided amongst my wife and children and the remaining part of the traps to be

equally divided amongst my wife and children like wise

I give all the rest of my personal estate to my well beloved wife Mary Farmer to her and her heirs forever

My desire is that all my children may be free and at this writing at the age of sixteen.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my well beloved wife Mary Farmer and my son John Farmer Executors to this my last will and testament and do acknowledge this to be my last will and testament signed and sealed in the presence of us James Farmer Seal

I John Farmer of the County of Johnston and Province of North Carolina
being very sick and weak in body but perfect mind and memory have
begiven unto God for the same and calling to mind the mortality of my
body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make and publish
this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of
all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it
and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and
secent manner at the discretion of my Executor touching that at the
general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power
of God and as touching such worldly Estate where with it shall please
God to bless me with in this life. I give service and dispose of the same in
manners and form following, that is to say.

I give and bequeath to my loving Brother James Farmer Two Young
black mare branded thus F in one ear
I give to my loving Brother Two Farmers one bay horse with a bald
face branded with the same brands

I give to my loving Brother Benjamin Farmer a sotull mare
I give and bequeath unto my loving Brother Ned one sotull
mare with a streak down her face

I give and bequeath unto my loving Sister Mary One hundred acres
of land lying and being on the North side of Neuse River in the
County adjoining the moat and a black mare and all else
also I desire that all the rest of my goods and chattels, traps and
cattle to be equally divided amongst my loving brothers and sisters
above named after my debts now due are paid also I leave
my loving Brother James and Benjamin Pusey my Executors
of this my last will and testament willed and bequeathed ratifying
and confirming this and no other to be my last will and
testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my

hand and seal the year and day above written. Signed sealed published
and declared by the said John Farmer as his last will and testament in the

In the Name of God Amen. This the ninth day of March in
the year of Christ One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty. I Philip Jones of
Johnston County in North Carolina being sick and weak in body but of
perfect mind and memory so make and ordain this my last will and
testament in the form and manner following - viz -

I desire that my general rights be celebrated and paid
I give my brother James Jones and to his heirs and assigns for ever in Consideration of Divers debts that I stand justly indebted to him to the value of Eighty
Pounds Virginia Money all my lands and other Estates real and personal with
the following Limitations and Provisions that off any other debts arise
against my estate or any dayoyer or Dower from or by my creditors or
creditors wife Children or any other person or persons whatsoever
that any such person or persons being dissatisfied with this
will may have election to enforce my said estate to be sold
at public sale and after the said Eighty pounds Virginia Money
is paid or raised the surplusage of my Estate first with regard
to the charges may be applied to the payment of any other debts the
still surplusage to be divided amongst my wife and children
in the same proportion as are interested Estate and I do hereby
appoint my said Brother James Jones my only and sole Executor
of this my last will and testament declining this and no other to be
my last will and testament I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
