

Will of James Jackson.

In the name of God Amen I James Jackson of the County of Johnston and state of North Carolina being in perfect sound mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I do make and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following to which is my will, desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be discharged quick as possible out of the most perishable property of my estate by my executor after mentioned

I give to my beloved and obedient wife of my bosom all my lands and premises one hundred and seventy acres, cattle hogs and sheep and geese and chickens and mares and farming tools and household furniture corn and fodder cotton and peas to her and her heirs lifetime and widowhood which I leave my wife executor to this my last will and testament have by my knowledge disannulling and making void all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I the aforesaid James Jackson have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 10th day of February 1831. sealed and delivered in the presence of us by the testator

Will of James Hoinnant

In the name of God Amen I James Hoinnant of the State of North Carolina and County of Johnston being in perfect mind, and memory blessed be God to this third day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following viz.

First I lend unto my beloved wife Martha Hoinnant all my lands on the west side of Buckhan Swamp except the Jacob Grace land including my home plantation containing seven hundred and fifty five acres during her natural life and at her death I give all the lands before mentioned except the Jacob Grace land to my beloved son Hardy Hoinnant to him and his heirs forever. I also lend unto my beloved wife Martha one negro man named George two negro women named Fester & Charity during her natural life and at her death I give unto my beloved daughter Elizabeth Hoinnant the negro woman Thobster to her and her heirs forever. Also at the death of my wife Martha I give unto my beloved daughter Martha Hoinnant the negro girl named Charity to her and her heirs forever. I also give unto my beloved wife Martha Hoinnant my black mare and gray horse saddle & bridle two cows & calves two sows & pigs twenty five head of dry hogs ten head of sheep ten geese and feathers bed and furniture all my kitchen furniture one loom and gear four plows and gear two grubbing hoes, two weeding hoes two axes one grind stone one pine chest two head of dry cattle all my bacon and lard on hand all my corn & fodder on hand to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Elizabeth Hoinnant one feather bed & furniture one cow and calf also the sum of ten dollars.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Mourning Barnes one negro boy named Randal during her natural life and at her death to belong to my beloved son William Hoinnant to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Mary Hoinnant one negro boy named Sam one feather bed and furniture one cow & calf also the sum of ten dollars
