

Will of Joseph Syms.

In the name of God Amen I Joseph Syms of the County of York
and State of South Carolina being sick and weak of body but of perfect
mind do make and ordain this instrument of writing to be my last
will and testament that is to say first I give to my beloved brother

Jacob Syms all my lands all my corn and bacon and mares and colts
one feather bed and steed, the mare is colled Pigeon and the
colt Lanny one half of my hogs one saddle and bridle five head
of cattle he may take his choice of them all my household
furniture all my clothes all my wheat that is now growing
two shot guns three narrow axes & all my plantation tools

Secondly My will and desire is that all the remainder of my property
be sold by my executors and not by the sheriff but at six
months credit and after my just debts is paid my will and
desire is that it be equally divided between my brothers
Benjamin Syms and Joel Syms Edmund Syms John Syms and my
sister Chester Wise. I hereby appoint my friend Ulysses Bass &
my brother Edmund Syms executors of this my last will
and testament revoking all former wills and testaments by me
made declaring this only to be my last will and testament
witness my hand and seal this third day of April 1800

Will of James Lockhart

I James Lockhart of Lancaster County and State of South
Carolina being in sound and perfect sense and memory Thanks
be to God for it do make and ordain this my last will and
testament revoking all other heretofore made

I lend to my beloved wife Hannah Hawkins Lockhart during
her widowhood no longer than one negro woman called Robin
two feather beds and furniture one table six knives and forks
four chairs two basins two dishes one chest one horse bridle
saddle one wooden wheel and cards one flat ditto &c hockle two
cows and calves two ewes and lambs two sows and pigs one iron
pot and hangers one dutch oven one pair smoothing irons
one tub, pail and bigger one weaving loom and gun and few
other articles such as she cannot conveniently keep house without
such as provisions for first year and the gear and privileges necessary
to support the Sea Beach and the lands and plantation wherein
I now dwell on the east side of the Wolf Pitt branch during
the above mentioned time and after that to them that may
have aright to enjoy it by law.

I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Lockhart one tract or
parcel of land bounded as follows beginning the south side
of Neuse River where Archibald Vining's upper line comes to the
river thence his line and mine to the north prong of Morris
Creek thence up the various courses of said prong to spring at
a large poplar thence a small distance by the spring a west
course to a line of mine that extends north and south then
with and along that line north to the Hatty branch then
down the various courses of the said branch as far as until
a north course will strike the head of a small branch that enters
into the river opposite the mouth of Dapworths creek the line
line to leave the Hatty Branch where it may strike the head of the
western prong of the branch at the upper spring then down the
various courses of said branch to the river then down the various
courses thereof to the beginning except what I have left to my
wife Hannah containing two hundred acres more or less to her
heirs and assigns forever including the sea beach after
mothers death.

All the rest of my lands except 200 acres on the poplar
I desire may be equally divided between my three sons viz,

Thomas Lockhart, Casey Lockhart and Elam Lockhart and
Elam Lockhart to have the plantation wherow I now dw
and his part of land joining to it to them their heirs
and assigns forever the two hundred acres to be sold by my
executors for the use of building a good decent dwelling house
for my wife to live in during the above time and if that shou
not be sufficient to complete it money arising any other
property must do it. If I do not do it in my life time

Item I give to my son Joel Lockhart one negro woman named
Sandy and one hundred and fifty dollars to him his heirs
and assigns forever.

Item I give to my son James Lockhart one negro man named
Harry to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give unto my son Battie Lockhart five dollars to
him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give unto my son Stephen Lockhart one negro man
named Judas and fifty dollars to him and his heirs
and assigns forever.

Item I give unto my son Joburn Lockhart one mulatto woman
named Pat to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give unto my son Thomas Lockhart one negro man
named Ned to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give unto my son Benjamin Lockhart one negro
girl named All to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give unto my daughter Patsy Lockhart one negro girl
named Kitter to his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give unto my daughter Edy one negro girl named Rose
to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give unto my son Casey Lockhart one negro boy named
All to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give unto my son Elam Lockhart one negro girl named

Esther to him his heirs and assigns forever.

A.B.

If any of my children should loose their negroes before they
receive them by death then my wife to distribute part of what
she hath left to her to give them some relief and all the rest
of my estate not willed away I desire it be sold to the
highest bidder by executors and executors hereafter mentioned
and John Lockhart to be paid thirty pounds out of it
and my son Thomas and all of my children that are
younger than him to have it equally divided between
them and I appoint my loving wife Hannah Hawkins
Lockhart, Robert Gully Dr Roborn Lockhart and Thomas Lock-
hart executors of this my last will and testament in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second
day of October one thousand seven hundred and ninety
