 last will and testament as in manner and form following

 charges may be paid and discharged by my executor
 herein after named after my decease I bequeath my soul
 unto the hands of God that gave it me and my body to
 be laid in the last span whence it came.

Item^{1st} I give to my well behaved wife Patsy Pool the land and
 plantation wherein I now live containing two hundred acres together
 with all and singular the improvements thereto appertaining, also
 one other tract of land containing eighty acres adjoining the
 lands of Reubin Sanders formerly the lands of Hardy Pool to
 her and her heirs forever.
 I further will and bequeath unto my above named beloved
 wife four negroes (viz), one negro woman by the name of Phillis
 together with her three children Minty, Lidia Lourena, and one other
 negro girl by the name of Phoeby to her and her heirs forever.

Item^{2nd} I will and bequeath unto my brother John Pool ten shillings
 current money of the state of North Carolina, to him his
 heirs and assigns forever.

Item^{3rd} I will and bequeath unto my brother Hardy Pool ten shillings
 current money of the State of North Carolina to him his heirs
 and assigns forever.

Item^{4th} I will and bequeath unto my brother Henry Pool ten shillings
 current money of the State of North Carolina to him and
 his heirs and assigns forever.

Item^{5th} I will and bequeath unto my sister Sally Clifton ten
 shillings current money of the State of North Carolina to
 her and her heirs and assigns forever.

Item^{6th} I will and bequeath unto my sister Phoeby Smith ten
 shillings current money of the State of North Carolina to
 her and her heirs forever. It is further my will that
 I give and bequeath unto my wife Patsy Pool the the residue
 of my property that is to say two feather beds bedstead and

and furniture together with all my household and kitchen
furniture three head of horses her riding saddle and bridle and
all my stock of hogs and cattle and all my geese, ducks and
chickens together with all my cider and brandy casks all my crop
of corn, peas, potatoes and fodder, and my still k, still tub and
such of the property besides that which I have given to my brother
and sisters to be disposed of to the payment of my just ^{and lawful} debts and
