

Will of James Wilder

To the name of God Amen I James Wilder of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being sick and weak in body but remaining still in perfect mind and disposing memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in form and manner as follows:

Item I do give and bequeath unto my well beloved son Reuben Wilder one mare colt and saddle to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I do give and bequeath unto my beloved son Jonathan Wilder one horse and saddle to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I do give and bequeath to my beloved son William Wilder one horse and saddle to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I do give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Mary Wilder one cow and calf and one bigger one feather bed and furniture and saddle to her her heirs assigns forever.

Item I do give and bequeath to my nephew James Wilder son of Culver Wilder deceased one horse and saddle provided he doeth with his and Elizabeth Wilder and wife with her till he is a man for himself to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I do lend unto my well beloved wife Elizabeth Wilder all my lands and all my estate not before mentioned or otherwise disposed of in this my last will and testament during her natural life or bridgesshead. Note it is my will and desire that she that is my wife give unto my youngest son William Wilder a reasonable education according to her circumstances and after her death or marriage (if she ever doth) It is my will and testament that all my land which it hath pleased God bless me with be equally divided between my three sons Reuben Wilder, Jonathan and William Wilder before named and it is my will and desire that all the other part of my estate that shall then remain at that time shall be equally divided between all my children and their heirs agreeable to law and lastly I do ordain and appoint my well beloved son Reuben Wilders and my beloved friend and brother-in-law Cader Bryan my true and lawful executors to this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling and making void all other wills and testaments by me made heretofore in witness whereof I have hereunto set and applied my hand and seal the twenty day of July 1815.
