

Will of Jesse Bailey

In the name of God Amen I Jesse Bailey of the State of North Carolina and County of Johnston being in a low state of health but in perfect mind and memory blessed be God to this ninth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & thirty nine do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following viz.

First - I lend unto my beloved wife Lincha Bailey the land and plantation whereon I now live at my death during her natural life containing three hundred & thirty three acres and at her death to be sold at public sale on a credit of six months by all or any one of my heirs to be sold on the premises & the money arising from the sale of said land to be equally divided between my surviving heirs at that time. I also give unto my wife Lincha Bailey all the stock of every kind that I may be possessed with at the time of my death consisting of horses cattle hogs and sheep. I also give unto my wife Lincha all my household and kitchen furniture consisting of feather beds & furniture chests tables cutting chairs iron gear, pewter & earthen ware pot iron and all and every utensil considered to be household & kitchen furniture also two guns one shot gun and one rifle & shot pouch and ammunition. I also give unto my wife Lincha Bailey all my crop that is on hand all my stock of provision that I may have on hand at the time of death all my plantation utensils of every kind consisting of plows, hoes, axes carts and every other article considered as plantation utensils all my cider casks and barrels saddle & bill notes and account that I may have due me at the time of death all my property not before mentioned I now give to my wife Lincha to her and her heirs forever. And I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Lincha Bailey executor to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and ^{seal} the day and year above written signed sealed published and declared by the testator Jesse Bailey as his last will and testament in the presence of us who have assented our names as witnesses

Will of Nancy Broadstreet

Smithfield March 16th 1835 Nancy Broadstreet being very low in bodily health and being desirous to make a will before I resign my breath and believing that I am in my right senses at this time blessed be God do hereby make and admit this my last will and testament viz.

I give my body to the worms and its mother earth upon whom it came and my soul unto the power of God who has been so gracious as to spare it to me so long as this.

To my infant child Paul Helme Broadstreet I give all my effects consisting 1 bed bedstead and furniture 1 trunk 1 large chest 2 tables & candle stand 1 wadler 4 bowls 1 tin bacon coffee pot and canister 3 tumblers 6 plates 3 chairs 1 loom & skillet 1 washing tub and candles nolies. I confess and acknowledge that I am indebted to Edith McPherson & Betty Daniel and their heirs & assigns the sum of seven dollars and fifty cents each and Betty Daniel is justly in my debt \$2.00 paid for her bed twenty and four dollars to Mr Daniel all the above effects I wish sold for money and put on interest for said child provided my mother should not keep house if she does keep house she can use the things as long as she does keep house In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal in year and date above written in the presence of
