the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seven
make and publish this my last will and testament in
manner following that is to say
I give to my daughter Jenny Keen one feather bed and
furniture

I give to my daughter Nelly Rose five shillings

I give to my daughter Philippia Keen one feather bed and furniture

I give to my daughter Alice Keen one feather bed and furniture

I lend to my beloved wife Patience Keen one hundred and
twenty-five acres of land including the plantation whereon
I do now live during her natural life or widowhood if she
is so disposed as to stay upon it, if not my will is it shall
be sold whenever she pleases to leave it and the money
arising therefrom I desire should be equally divided between

my five youngest children to wit Henry Keen Patience Keen

Bettie Keen Nancy Keen and Bethany Keen

I also lend to said wife all the remainder of my property
of what kind soever it be during her natural life or widow-
hood and at her second marriage or decease my will is that
it should be equally divided between my five youngest chil-
dren as before mentioned

And I do hereby make and ordain my worthy friends Henry
Jassee and my wife Patience Keen executors and executrix
to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I
the said Jassee Keen have to this my last will and testament
set my hand and seal the day and year above written

Will of Jesse Wood Jr

In the name of God Amen this the 24th of January 1818
I Jesse Wood Jr of Wake County planter do make this my
last will and testament in the following manner

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy Wood one
bay mare one woman's saddle and bridle one feather bed and
furniture one linen wheel all my kitchen furniture all my
earthen ware one case of knives and forks all my sitting
chairs all the cotton wool and the flax I have on hand
together with one years provisions for herself Harriet Easter
and child or children to her heirs and assigns forever.

I also desire that my two negro boys hired out by my
executors yearly and for my wife to draw the money
for the support of Harriet and Easter and child or children
and herself Lou and Arthur.

I also lend to my wife one negro girl by the name
of Easter the labour and be clear of all expence untill Harriet
my daughter becomes to be eighteen years of age or mar-
ried. Lou and Arthur to my wife her life time or widowhood
as above mentioned and Easter at my daughter Harriet manor
as mentioned to her in deed of gift as ready made to her
her heirs and assigns forever.

At my wife death or marriage Lou and Arthur to be equally
divided between my daughter Bannister Johnson and my daughter
Harriet Wood and in case of Harriet Wood before she marries
or becomes to the age of eighteen dies Easter and her increase
come to my daughter Bannister Johnson to heirs and assigns
forever and also for Harriet to go to school one year and to be
boarded in the best of houses in case she cant go from home

To heirs of Sally Bassor five shillings apiece in cash
to them their assigns forever to soninlaw Bannister Lester
and his wife Betsy Lester the sum of five shillings in
cash to them their heirs and assigns forever and to my son-
inlaw John Pollock and his wife Eugene the sum of five
shillings in cash to them their heirs & assigns forever and to
my son Jesse Wood the sum of five shillings in cash to
them his heirs and assigns forever and to my soninlaw
Saml. Johnson of Wake County and my daughter Nancy his
wife the sum of five shillings to them heirs and assigns
forever. I give to my daughter Harriet Wood seven head
of cattle that is known to be called hem and also

dark bay filly with a star in her forehead and to my daughter
Brenister Johnston one walnut table my beausau I lend to my wife
Nancy Wood her life time or widowhood and also my riding chain
and harness and during her life time or widowhood and then to
my daughter Brenister Johnston her heirs and assigns forever and
the balance of my property not herein disposed of to be sold and
pay my just debts twelve months credit in case of any overplus
to my grand daughter Harriet Wood Johnson also one bedding
brick to the value of fifty dollars also thirty dollars in due
clothing and also in case of overplus to Elie Westwood Johnston to be
put to use of schooling one year common schooling and one to St.
academy when he comes to thirteen years of age this to be done
by the executors

I also constitute and appoint my son Jesse Wood Jr and my
son in law West Johnson executors to this my last will and

and State of North Carolina being very sick and low in state
of health but of sound mind and memory thanks be to
God for it do make and ordain this my last will and
testament principally and first of all I recommend my soul
into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body
to the earth to be buried in a decent manner and as touch-
ing such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless
me with in this life I give and devise of the same in
the following manner and form (viz)

I give and bequeath to my beloved nephew Henry Talton
one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to Cullen Talton one feather bed
and furniture and my young mare and all my stock
of sheep and all my Pewter and my chest and one table
and all my earthen ware and one skillet and a parcel
of books to him the said Cullen Talton and his heirs
forever and I do affoint my trusty friend Jonathan
Talton executor to this my last will and testament and I do
hereby disannull all and every other will and testament ratifying
and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament
in witnesses whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
