

Will of Jethro Woodard

In the name of God Amen the eleventh day of August 1814
 I Jethro Woodard of Johnston County and State of North Carolina being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian like burial at the discretion of my executors and as touching such worldly estate where with it hath pleased God to help me with in this life I give and dispose of the same in following manner and form.

^{in prima} I give to Sarah Woodard my dearly beloved wife my plantation wherein I now live by her to be possessed during her lifetime also the crop now growing and all my working tools of every kind to my wife during her lifetime also one bay mare to her lifetime also two feather beds and furniture to my wife during her lifetime also all my household goods and kitchen furniture to my wife during her lifetime also all my stock of cattle except one cow and one heifer to her her lifetime also all my stock of hogs, sheep and geese to her during her lifetime

^{Item} I give to my beloved son Jesse Woodard all the land and plantation wherein I now live after the decease of my wife to him and his heirs forever also one gray mare saddle and bridle to him and his heirs forever also the bay mare that I give to my wife her lifetime after her death to him and his heirs forever also all my stock of cattle that I give to my wife her lifetime after her death I give to my beloved son Jesse Woodard to him and his heirs forever except one cow and calf also I give my son Jesse Woodard all my hogs that I give to my wife her lifetime after her death him and his heirs forever also all my stock of sheep in like manner to him and his heirs after her death except four head also I give my son Jesse Woodard one feather bed and furniture also the two beds and furniture and all my working tools and all my household and kitchen furnit-

that I give my wife after her death I give it all to
son Jesse Woodard also one shot gun to him and his heirs
forever.

Item To my beloved sons James Woodard, Matthew Woodard and
Woodard and Jesse my still to be equally divided between
them all.

Item I give to two daughters Fanny and Nancy Price ten shillings

Item I give to my daughter Betty Woodard one feather bed
and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Sarel Woodard one cow and calf
and all my stock of geese that I give to my wife her
lifetime after her death to my daughter Sarel and her
heirs forever also I give to my daughter Sarel Woodard
one feather and furniture to her and her heirs forever also
four head of sheep that I gave to my wife her life
time after her death to my daughter Sarel and her
heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Alice Richardson one cow and one
heifer to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my beloved grand daughter Phoebe Woodard one
gray filly to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my beloved grandson Perry Woodard bay horse
colt and eight-head of hogs which is now called his own
to him and his heirs forever.

I likewise constitute and appoint my two sons James
Woodard and Jesse Woodard my executors of this my last
will and testament who I desire may receive the different
sum of money due me also out of the same to pay my
debts and so hereby certify allow all the bequests and execu-
tors by me named willed or bequeathed satisfying and confirm-
ing this and all other to be my last will and testaments
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this 11th of August 1814 being the day and first
above written

Will of Patience Heimant

In the name of God Amen I Patience Heimant of Johnston County
being of sound mind, and memory blessed be God for the same
I do make and publish this my last will and testament
in the manner following that is to say

I give and bequeath to my beloved mother Sarah Heimant
one negro girl by the name of Smithy and one mule for about
\$70.00

I give and bequeath to my beloved brothers and sisters the
balance of my estate be it of whatever kind or nature it may
be Joseph Heimant Jr., Stephen Heimant, Gilphie Goyner and
Sarah Barnes. Signed the 3rd of November 1820
