

John Daughtry's Will

In the Name of God Amen - The Twenty Third day of February in the year of our Lord 1761 - I John Daughtry of North Carolina in the County of Johnston Planter being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory. Thanks be to God, therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, so make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors, Nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give, devise, and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

I give and bequeath to my son Arthur Daughtry the Plantation whereon I now dwell and One Hundred acres of Land thereunto belonging to him his heirs and assigns for ever also one small Iron Pot and one large pewter dish and two plates also one Cow and yearling

I give and bequeath to my son Pompey Daughtry One Hundred Acres of Land lying and adjoining the East line of this tract whereon I now dwell and being the upper part of this tract to him and his heirs and assigns for ever also one small gray horse to be sold and the value laid out in schooling my son Pompey also I give one large pewter dish and two plates and one small gun and sword also one feather bed also one pair of Deer skin Serge and jacket of Garrison serge and Coats hat

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Daughtry one small pewter dish and one plate and one Cow and yearling and one middle size Iron pot

I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Daughtry one small pewter dish and one plate also one Cow and spinning wheel also one small trunk

I give to my eldest son John Daughtry five shillings

I give to Mary my wife my riding horse bridle and saddle and two Cows and yearlings, three sows and pigs also the rest of my wine hogs, one large pewter dish and two small also four pewter plates and two basins and one Soper and half of spoons also one large Iron Pot and one middle size and one Iron Skillet and one frying Pan one Cow Iron and Lead one small looking glass one feather bed and furniture two spinning wheels one large and one linen, one large chest and the rest and remainder of my estate which I give to Mary my wife whom I constitute make and ordain my only and sole Executor of this my last will and testament I hereby utterly disallow and disannul all and every other former testament wills and legacies bequeaths and Executors by me in any way or form this time named called and bequeathed writing and bearing witness this and no other to be my last will and

testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written. signed, sealed, published and pronounced by the said John Daughtry as his last will and testament in the presence of us the subscribers

Solomon Hinton's Will

In the Name of God Amen - I Solomon Hinton of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina Planter being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory. Thanks be given unto God. Calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die so make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and renounce my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

I send unto my loving wife Sarah Hinton one Negro girl named Phillis during her widowhood and at her death or marriage my devise is the said Negro Girl and her increase shall be equally divided between my two children, also I give unto her one work horse and one mare, bridle and side saddle and my stock of Cattle and fowls sows and pigs and fifteen head of two year old hogs and thirteen head of sheep and one feather bed bedstead and furniture and all my pewter and one Iron Pot

I give unto my loving daughter Esda Hinton one Negro woman named Mall and one Negro boy named Scotland

I give to my loving son Willis Hinton my land Plantation Appurtenances and Tenements that I now live on and one hundred and fifty acres of land entered and surveyed adjoining my Plantation land and one Negro woman named Chlo and one Negro boy named Abram and one feather bed, bedstead and furniture

I leave all the remainder of personal estate to be sold at the discretion of my Executors and to be equally divided amongst my wife and children

I do here by appoint my brothers Rudolph Hinton & William Hinton Executors of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former testament wills legacies bequest and Executors by me in any way or form named called and bequeathed writing this and no other to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th day of Oct in the year of our Lord 1778 Solomon Hinton Seal
