Will of John Dudley
In the name of God Amen

I John Dudley of Johnston County in the Province of North Carolina planter being sick in body but of perfect mind and memory thank to god do make this my last will and testament in form following truly mortally sorry for my sins past most humbly desiring forgiveness of the same I commit my soul to Almighty God trusting to be saved through the merits of Jesus Christ and my body to be buried where it shall please my Executors hereafter named to appoint and as the settling of my temporal estate as it has pleased god to bestow upon me I order give and dispose the same in manner and form following I desire my land to be sold first my dwelling place and a tract or parcels of land that I bought of William Land. I desire the said land to be sold to pay debts I will and bequeath to my wife Rachel all the over plus of the money of land after my debts are paid I Will and Bequeath to my wife Rachel all my House Hold Goods and Furnishings and all my Stock Horses and cattle and hogs all my moreable stock I will and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Ann one Shilling Sterling money and no more I will and bequeath to my son John One shilling sterling money and no more I will and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth one shilling Sterling money I will and bequeath to my son David One shilling sterling money and no more and I constitute and appoint Richard Bogdell and David Dudley Executors of this will and testament Witness whereof I have herein to set my hand and seal my seal the 15th Day of November 1762
