

William Pool's Will

In the Name of God Amen - 26th day of September Anno Domini
 I William Pool of Johnston County being sick in body but of good and
 perfect memory, thanks be to Almighty God and calling to remembrance the
 uncertain estate of his transitory life and that death must yeild unto death
 when it shall please God to call do make and declare this my last will and
 testament in manner and form following - First I give and command my soul
 unto Almighty God my savior and releaser in whom and by whose merits I live
 and believe assuredly to be saved and to have full remission of all my
 sins and to inherit the Kingdom of Heaven and my body I commit to the earth to
 be decently buried at the discretion of my executors hereinafter named and for
 the settling of my temporal estate and such goods and chattels and debts as it shall
 please God to bestow upon me I do ordain give and direct the same in manner
 and form following:

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved son John my manner Plantation after
 my wife's decease or marriage with one hundred acres or more or less to try him on
 the river at a place called the New Ford and so by a line of marked trees to the
 back line at the place where the Beaver Creek path crosses the said line and
 eight pounds pone

Item I give and bequeath the other part of the said two hundred acres lying on the
 upper bank of the surry to my well beloved son David and ten pounds Pone -

Item I give and bequeath my land called the Beaver dam land unto my well
 and beloved son Samuel - Ten pounds Pone -

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife my negro woman Bess and
 likewise two feather beds and furniture my riding horse Rock and one more
 the Indian mare with a side saddle called her saddle and likewise land for the
 use of my manner plantation during her life or widow hood

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Sarah one feather bed and furniture
 and ten pounds pone

Item I give and bequeath to my well and beloved daughter Penitence one feather bed
 and furniture and fifteen pounds Pone - and if my wife should die with child
 and that she should be born and live I do give and bequeath thirty five
 pounds Pone -

That my will and desire is that all my stock horse, cattle, hogs, sheep, and
 geese and eight gees and another branch land to sold at the discretion of
 my executors hereof mentioned all the expenses paid and the rest of the money
 arising by the said sale to be equally divided among all my children
 I give and bequeath all the remaining part of my estate to my well
 beloved wife excepting what ready money I have I desire my wife
 to paid out of and the rest to my wife, and I hereby make

and appoint my loving wife and loving friend Neasham Bryant and Nathan
 Williams Executrix and executor to this my last will and testament hereby
 revoking and distolling and making void all former wills and testaments by
 me made, and delivering this only to be my last will and testament In the
 witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the
 day and year before mentioned

In the Name of God Amen - Thirteenth day of December Anno Dom 1769
 I John Edens of the County of Johnston being sick of body but of perfect
 mind and memory, thanks be to Almighty God and calling to remembrance the
 uncertain estate of this transitory life and that all flesh must yeild unto
 death when it shall please God to call do make and declare this my
 last will and testament in manner and form following First I command
 my soul to Almighty God my savior and my body I commit to the earth to
 be decently buried at the discretion of my executors herefore named
 and for the settling of my temporal estate such goods and chattels as it
 hath pleased all mighty God for above my to bestow upon me. I do
 order give and dispose of the same in manner and form following (that is to say)
 I give and bequeath my plantation and all my land to my well
 beloved son John Edens and that my well and beloved wife Elizabeth
 Edens have the use of the plantation with one third part of the land
 during her life time

Item I give and bequeath all the remainder of my estate after debts being
 paid to be equally divided between my wife and all my children
 viz William, Mary, Elizabeth, Priscilla, Anne, Martha and
 John. I hereby make and appoint my well beloved wife Elizabeth
 Edens and my well beloved son William Edens my sole Executrix and
 Executor of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and affix my seal
