Andrew Hartfield's Will

In the Name of God Amen,

I Andrew Hartfield of the County of Johnston and Province of North Carolina Planter swearing the Mortality of my Body and that it is appointed for all men once to die, do hereby make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say principally I bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it to me nor doubting but my ever blessed Saviour will restore it to me again at the day of General resurrection and my body to be buried in a decent & Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors to be hereafter named and as to what worldly substance it has pleased God to bestow upon me after paying all my lawful debts and funeral expenses I leave and bequeath it in the following manner viz:

Impresses

I leave and bequeath my two Plantations the tract of land pertaining to them to my three beloved sons Godfrey, Richard & John to be equally divided among them only it is my will and desire that the plantation wherein I now live may be included in the share of my son Godfrey and that the plantation wherein I now live may be included in the share of my son John Thomas Smith now living may be included in the share of my son John I leave and bequeath to my said beloved son Godfrey my Shiled gun and one Cow and Calf and one cow and one mare I formerly gave him.

Item

I leave and bequeath to my said beloved son Richard my tract smooth gun and one cow and Calf and one cow and one mare which I formerly gave him

Item

I leave and bequeath to my said beloved son my other smooth gun and one Cow and Calf and one cow it is my will and desire that my said son John may have the first Call that my own mare brings I leave and bequeath to my beloved son Andrew one cow and a mare and Calf which I formerly gave him

Item

I leave and bequeath to my beloved daughter Rebecca a home which I formerly gave her

Item

I leave and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Hartfield one third part of my whole remaining and moveable estate to be enjoyed during her natural life

Item

I bequeath the other two thirds of my movable estate and all my other estate both real and personal that I now not hereby disposed of to my following beloved children Joseph & Mary, Rebecca, Andrew, Dick and Betty to be equally divided among them, and I hereby appoint William Bealeby and my two beloved sons Joseph and Godfrey Executors of this my last will and Testament revoking all former wills by me made and destroying this to be my

only last will and testament.

In the name of God Amen - This the 11th Day of Jan in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and sixty two - I John Grinnan of Johnston County being sick and weak of body, but of a perfect mind and memory thank God for it and calling to mind the mortality of man and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form following To Z. I give and bequeath unto my dear and beloved wife Mary Grinnan and to her and her heirs all my Estate Real and Personal she paying my lawful debts and so ordain whole and sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament. Revoking and disannulling all former wills and wills by me made or done and so declare this and no other to be my last will and Testament.
