

Will of John Harper.

I John Harper of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will & testament in manner & form following that is to say

First- Item That my executor herein after named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts whatsoever and to whomever owing out of the money that first comes into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item I give and devise to my beloved wife Winnifred Harper seven hundred and thirty acres of land it including all of the lands that I am possessed of bounded by Alexander Meunns, Sir William Lassiter and others wherein I now live so as to include my mansion house and out houses and other improvements to have and to hold to her the said Winnifred Harper for and during the term of her natural life or widowhood in satisfaction for and in lieu of her dower and third of and in all my real estate and then to be equally divided between my only son John D. Harper and two daughters Eleanor Harper and Esteban V. T. Harper.

Item I give and bequeath to my said beloved wife Winnifred Harper three negroes one boy one girl & one woman to have and to hold to her the said Winnifred Harper for and during the term of her natural life or widowhood and then to be equally divided between my only said son & two daughters.

Item I give and bequeath to my said beloved wife Winnifred Harper all of my beds and furniture and all of my household and kitchen furniture all of my horses all of the sheep all of the cattle all of the hogs all of the domestic fowls and poultry, all the crop of every description that may be upon the plantation wherein I now live and all the provisions on hand at the time of my death to have and to hold to her the said Winnifred Harper for and during the term of her natural life or widowhood then to be divided between my said daughters.

Item I give and bequeath to my said beloved wife Winnifred Harper the family carriage one east one brass still and fixtures and all farming tools one set of blacksmith tools to

have and to hold to her the said Winnifred Harper for an during the term of her natural or widowhood then to be equally divided between my said son and daughters.

I give and bequeath to my said beloved wife Winnifred Harper one shot gun her choice all of my money notes and accounts to have and to hold to her the said Winnifred Harper for and during her natural life or widowhood then to be equally divided between my said son and daughters.

I give and bequeath to my son John D. Harper two guns one rifle and one shot gun as his right and property forever And lastly I do hereby <sup>constitute</sup> appoint my trusty friend my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me here before made.

In witness whereof I the said John Harper do hereunto set my hand and seal this 19<sup>th</sup> day of March A.D. 1860 Signed sealed published and declared by the <sup>test</sup> John Harper to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence do subscribe our names as witnesses thereto.
