

John Hinman or 'Will'

In the Name of God Amen - the 15th day of March in the year of our Lord 1767
 I John Hinman Esq^r of Johnston County & Province of North Carolina planter
 being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thankes to god
 unto God for the same and calling to mind the mortality of my body
 and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die to make and
 ordain this my last will and testament That is to say principally and
 first of all I give and regeant my soul unto the hands of God
 gave it me for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a
 Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my executors
 nothing doubting true as the general resurrection I shall receive the
 same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly
 estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I
 give and dispose of the same in manner and forme following This is to say
 in the first place.

I give and bequeath to my son William Hinman One hundred acres of land
 where he now lives or in more or less. I also give and bequeath to him my
 Negro woman Sera

I give and bequeath to his son James Hinman one negro boy named
 Tom I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Drexel one negro boy called Sampson
 I give and bequeath to my son John Hinman the manner plantation
 and all the lands joining it in Johnston County.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Barbara Gully one negro gal named
 Hannah and thirty acres of land in Edgecombe County lying on the north side
 of Continenca Creek it being a part of a large tract which I have left
 to my son John Hinman

I give and bequeath to my daughter Pascence Mowen one negro boy named
 Jocko.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Elsa one negro boy named Jocko and
 one negro gal named Jessie and One bed and furniture and one chest
 which I have all ready delivered to her and for my daughter Elsa to have
 her part of my estate at the years of eighteen or married

I leave to James Grice my negro fellow deser and my negro woman Hannah
 upon paying ten pounds to each of my children except John Hinman to be paid
 within two years

and all the rest of my Goods and Chattels of whatsoever kind I desire that they
 should be equally divided amongst all my children and if any of my
 children should not agree I desire that they may choose one man and the
 other two another and that they shall stand to what they say and shall do
 I likewise constitute and make and ordain James Grice and John Hinman
 and William Hinman my sons my sole and only Executors of this my
 last will and testament and I do here by utterly disallow revoke &
 cancel all and every other former testamente and wills and

legacies request and Executors by me in any way before this time named called or
 requested confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the Day and year above written
 signed, sealed and delivered in the presence

John Hinmans "Will"

In the name of God Amen -

I John Hinman of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being of
 sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be to God so this the 14th Day of
 April 1767 made publish this my last will and testament in manner
 following that is to say -

First I send my wife my plantation wheron I now live during her life or
 widow hood Also I send her one negro fellow by the name of Will one negro
 woman by the name of Aera one negro woman by the name of Roset, one
 Horse by the name of Jack one do by the name of Buck and one mare by
 the name of Dall, Three Cows and Calves, twenty one head of sheep one
 yoke of work steers and one by Calf, one still and all my house hold
 and Kitchen furniture with the only exception of two beds and the furniture
 thirty head of hogs all my working implements of husbandry. Now it is to be
 naturally understood that the above personal property that I have here left
 to my wife if she marries or after her death should she not marry
 to be sold all of it except the negroes and One hundred Acres of the ground
 special sale to be given to my two daughters that is fifty Dollars to each and
 the balance of what property that is directed to be sold to be equally divided
 between my four sons - secondly I give and bequeath to Jonathan Hinman
 my son all the land on the east side of Great Buffalow swamp one negro
 fellow by the name of Willis and the one half of the grist mill and the
 one half of the saw mill, fifteen Gun and all my right and title to
 the half acre of land on which side of the Great Buffalow swamp
 where the said mill stands with my right and title of the log fort
 and wheels belonging to the mill and also with my half and my part
 of all the land covered by the mill pond water to the highest water mark
 heretofore held or hereafter held and also with all the timber that I
 purchased of Jonathan Hamton that is growing or lying on the land that

formerly belonged to the land that said Heimant purchased of Duncan Jordan
 Thirfty I give and bequeath to my son Berry Heimant one negro woman name Mila Negro
 girl name Louisa and after my wifes right comes to the negro Will I give him to
 my said Son Berry and likewise in the same manner my negro woman named Aria.
 Twently I give and bequeath unto my daughter Callie one negro woman by the Name of Lucy
 one girl by the Name of Bessie one feather bed and furniture.
 Diftly I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth one negro woman by the Name of
 Sarah and one negro woman by the Name of Lucy one feather bed and furniture.
 Thirtly I give and bequeath to my son Josiah the land wherein I have left to my wife
 after her right comes to it agreeable instruction of my will one Negro boy named
 Scott one Negro girl by the Name of Dilsey
 Fourtly I give and bequeath to my son Jessie Heimant one negro woman and her income
 from to day thar I went to my wife by the Name of Rachel which negro woman
 and her increase he is to have after my wifes right comes as above repre-
 sented One Negro boy by the Name of Merit one Negro girl by the Name of
 Dilley One Negro boy by the Name of Emiley - Now it is hereby especially
 understood that if Josiah or Jessie should die a minor that the sum
 money and living don shall have the estate of the deceased son real and
 personal and likewise the balance of my personal estate that I have not
 mentioned in my will my desire is that it shan't be sold and after
 paying all my just debts the balance of such proceeds to be equally
 divided between my two youngest sons Josiah and Jessie. And I do hereby
 make and ordain my worthy friend Joseph Richardson my executor of
 this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I the said John
 Heimant have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal
 the day and year above written.

In the Name of God Amen - The 1st day of July 1763 - I Jacob Parker Brewer in the
 County of Johnston and State of N^o Carolina planter being very sick and weak in body but
 of perfect mind and memory thanks to god therefore calling unto mind the mortaliy
 of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die so make and Ordain
 this my last will and testament that is to say principally and as touching such worldly
 estate wherewith it hath bin pleased god to bless me in this life I give devise and
 dispose of the same in the following manner and forms

I send unto Martha my beloved wife the land and Plantation whereon I now
 dwell with all singular my goods and chattels and all my personal estate
 During of her natural life and after her death to be equally divided between
 my son David Brewer and my daughter Jean Brewer I also constitute and
 appoint Martha my wife and my son David Brewer Executor and Executor of
 this my last will and testament

I give my beloved son David Brewer all the land whereon he dwells on and a part
 of the land whereon I dwell to be divided beginning above my plantation in
 the first line of the fence and running westwards close above the plantation to the
 East most line containing by estimation Two Hundred and fifty acres to him
 and his heirs forever

I give the remainder of my land unto my beloved daughter Jean Brewer
 and the plantation whereon I now dwell after her mothers death to
 her and her heirs forever

And I do hereby utterly disannul all and every
 other former will or testament ratifying this and no other to be
 my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal the day and year first above written signed
 sealed published pronounced and declared by the said Jacob Parker Brewer as his
 last will and testament in the presence of us the subscribers
