

Will of John Hinton

State of North Carolina Johnston. In the name of God Amen
I John Hinton Sr being of sound mind and perfect memory
blessed do this ^{instrument of writing} instant day of March 1823 do make and publish
this as my last will and testament in the manner and form as
followeth that is to say,

I lend to my beloved wife Charlotte Hinton thirteen negro slaves
named as followeth, Ned, Winny, Davy, Cain, Daniel, Lewis, Pias,
Toley, Vinny, Pllana, Kizzz, Lucas and Edoy and their increase
and one copper still and one set of blacksmith tools during
her widowhood or lifetime

Also I give to my fore said wife all of my stock of
cattle and one yoke of oxen 4 carts and wheels and two mares
and one colt and one mule and all of my stock of sheep
and all of my stock of hogs and all of my crop of corn and
wheat and fodder and all of my bacon and lard and cider
casks and all my feather beds and steds and furniture
and all of my household and kitchen furniture and kitchen
working utensils and all of my plantation working tools
and my hand mill and grind stone and all of my bar-
ren land all of my saw cowhides and leather.

I also lend to my said wife the land and plantation
whereon I now live to her during widowhood or lifetime
I also give to my fore said wife one woman saddle and two
mens saddle and bridle.

Item I lend to my son Matthew Hinton the plantation whereon
he lives until his son Theophilus Hinton comes of the age of
twenty one years then I give the aforesaid land that I have
lent to my son Matthew Hinton to his son Theophilus Hin-
ton it being the same land I bought of Daniel Tucker
also I give to the said Theophilus Hinton two negro
slaves (viz) Fanny and Mary and their increase and one
cow and two hyslings is at this time in the possession
Matthew Hinton. Also I give to my son Matthew Hinton five
dollars in money.

Item I give to my son John Hinton Jr the land and planta-
tion whereon he now lives together with one hundred acres of
land adjoining the lands of the said John Hinton now
lives on the line to run east to meet so as to take of
one hundred acres also I give to said John Hinton Jr
one negro man named Ben and all the notes of hand and

book accounts that I hold against him the said John Hinton
to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Isaac Hinton all that part of my land
that is lying on west side of a line of marked trees begin-
ning at Gile Joseph Hinton's corner and runs east with said
Joseph line to a red Oak corner then north to a blazed pine
opposite the Joseph Hinton hickory corner near his fence then to
the head of the Rocky branch then down various courses of the
said branch to Noddica line then with his line to a pine
in the Busbee branch then south with said line a Spanish oak
Joseph Hinton corner then a straight line to a hickory near
said Joseph fence then with his line to the beginning together
with one hundred and fifty acres of piney woods land adjoining
of the aforesaid tract to be taken of from the west side
of a four hundred acres tract also one set of blacksmith tools
and six negro slaves named as followeth I give to Isaac Hinton
after the death or probition of his mother Davy, Cain, Dannel, Jay
Leary and Beas also one school horse bridle and saddle and their
increase to him and his heirs forever.

Item I lend to my daughter Candis Lee five dollars in money
to her and Ther heirs forever.

Item I lend to my daughter Harriet Cooper one negro woman
slave Virgil to her during her life time and her increase
after the death of my foun said daughter ^{Harriet} Cooper I give the
aforesaid negro slave Virgil and her increase to the aforesaid
Harriet Cooper children begotten of her own body to be equally
divided between them.

Item I give to my daughter Boley Hinton one negro woman
named Tiley and her increase also one new painted chest
and one woman saddle to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to daughter Poley Hinton one negro woman slave
named Vinny and her increase to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Delila Hinton one negro woman
Pllsee and her increase to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Mary Hinton one negro girl named
Lemmy and her increase to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Willis Hinton seven negro slaves to wit - Fred, Minny, Abel, Talley, Lewis, Kizzy and Edny and their increase to him and his heirs forever after the widowhood or death of his mother. I have lent the negroes I have given to Willis Hinton to his mother except Abel also I give to my son Willis Hinton all the ballance of my land including the land and plantation I now live on and one hundred and fifty acres of piney woods land it being the ballance of the four hundred acres tract mentioned. Therefore also I give my son Willis Hinton one copper still and ball jaer colt to him and his heirs forever.

Item All the money arising from the sale of my property not given away in the above writing, I give to my wife and four daughters named as followeth, Betsey, Patsy, Delila and Mary to be equally divided between them.

I hereby make and ordain worthy friends Joseph Hinton and Elusae Hinton executors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I John Hinton Sr have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and date above written signed sealed and published by the said John Hinton Sr testator as my last will and testament -

Will of Frederick Holloman

In the name of God Amen I Frederick Holloman of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being weak of body but of perfect mind and memory (Blessed God) do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say,

First I give and devise to Patsy Holloman daughter of Seth Holloman who hath lived in my house for many years all my real and personal estate (to wit) Three hundred acres of land being the land and plantation whereon I now live also eleven negroes (to wit) Simon, Moses, Jim, Ben, Tom, Rose, Keilly, Mourning, Charity, Wuffin and Abel, also my stock of horses and cattle, sheep with all my household furniture working tools also what cash is on hand with such debts that should be due me with every species of property that I possess whether mentioned or not to her the said Patsy Holloman her heirs and assigns forever.

Secondly My will and desire is that all my just debts shall punctually be paid by my executor and that my executor sell and private sale or publick as much of stock as will be sufficient provided there shall not be cash in hand enough.

Thirdly I appoint the aforesaid Patsy Holloman my executrix to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I the said Frederick Holloman have set my hand and seal this twenty sixth day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty three.
