Will of John Hayles Sr

In the name of God Amen I John Hayles Sr of State of North Carolina and Johnston County through the abundant mercy of God altho weak in body yet of a sound mind and perfect understanding and memory do constitute this my last will and Testament and desire it may be received by all as such first I most humbly bequeath my soul to God who gave it as my worldly estate which it hath pleased God to give me my will and desire is that it be divided in manner and form following after all my just debts are paid.

Item I lend unto my loving wife Cynthia Hayles during her natural life or widowhood and no longer one hundred acres of land whereas I now live with all the buildings on the same with the plantation and all the improvements thereon also nine negroes (to wit) Watt, Tom, Walt, Jane, Oliver, Kasey, Hunter, Rodden and Comby also three feather beds and furniture also six head of horses nineteen head of cattle and also my stock of hogs.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Hayles to him and his heirs forever the sum of ten shillings.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son James Hayles to him and his heirs forever the sum of ten shillings.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Jay Hayles to him and his heirs forever the sum of ten shillings.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Lucas Hayles to him and his heirs forever the sum of ten shillings.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Parolfe Hayles to her and her heirs forever the sum of ten shillings.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Hayles and his heirs forever the sum of ten shillings.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Cynthia Hayles to her and heirs forever the sum of ten shillings and my will and desire is that my wife Cynthia Hayles have the sole care of my children untill they come to lawful age and then for my wife Cynthia Hayles to give them property as she sees fit.

Item I give and bequeath unto my wife Cynthia Hoales all the remaining part of my worldly estate both personal and real including her natural life a widowhood and do constitute and appoint my wife Cynthia Hoales and John Vinson Esq and Elisha Thomas executors of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 15th of March 1804.

Item It is my will and desire in case that my beloved wife should marry then for my property to be equally divided among my children

Item I doth nominate and appoint my beloved wife Judy Jones Benjamin Smith and Isaac Jones executors and executors to this my last will and testament against all others wills or form and wills in witness whereof I the said Burrwell Jones have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 4th day of March 1804 signed sealed and acknowledged in the presence of
