Will of John Joyner

I John Joyner of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say

That my executors herein after named to pay all my just debts as I shall herein after provide for them to do.

Item 1 I give and bequeath unto my son Turner Joyner one bed bedstead and furniture one chest three setting chairs one half dozen teacups & saucers one half dozen plates.

Item 2 I give and bequeath unto my son William H. Joyner one bed bedstead and furniture one cow and calf one chest three setting chairs one sow and pigs two ewe lambs one half dozen plates one set of tea cups & saucers one new bridle and saddle and one horse price fifty dollars when he is twenty-one years old and all the lands called my home plantation where I now live with the exception of what I have heretofore given my son Turner a deed for the lands given to William H. Joyner contains a part of the Stephen Hinman land and in full the Godwin land and all the Parker land though not to have possession of the land until after the death of my beloved wife Zilphia Joyner.

Item 3 I give and bequeath unto my grandson John Eggin Joyner fifty dollars after the death of my wife Zilphia Joyner on these conditions that is if he lives to the age of twenty-one years or more and leaves a living child and if not and it being passed over to his guardian & to him my will is that it to be returned back to my estate in equal division among all my 5 children

Item 4 I give and bequeath unto my daughter Patience Faustelle Tempa Rainey and Martha Jane Bagley the undivided share in the old stock of negro Lena and her family that I bought of Joel Hinman and his wife Linda a third share being the seventh share in said negroes according to the right William Hinman to my wife Zilphia Joyner

and one horse valued at fifty dollars, or fifty dollars a piece in money at the death of my wife Zippah Joyner.

Item 5 My will is that my executor sell as much of my property as my wife Zippah Joyner can best do without & as will take to pay any just debts &c and if any remainder in their hands from the sale that my wife Zippah Joyner have the same.

Item 6 I give and bequeath unto my son Turner Joyner, William R. Joyner, Patience Tutell and the heirs begotten by her body Jemmy Rains and the heirs begotten by her body after all my just debts is payed the following slaves namely Dan, Caroline, Jabel, Joe, Nathan, Appy & Liza to be equally divided among them all five.

Item 7 I give and devise to my beloved wife Zippah Joyner her lifetime all the balance of my property of every kind that is not above given away both real and personal after all my just debts is paid and Henry S. in conditions that his conduct is agreeable to me & if not for my wife Zippah Joyner, Turner and William Henry to come to conclusion as they think proper to dispose of him and after her death all the property given to her to be equally divided between all five of my children.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my truly sons Turner Joyner and William R. Joyner my lawfull executors to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereof respecting and declare utterly void all other wills or testaments by me heretofore made in witness whereof I the said John Joyner do hereby set my hand and seal this the 20th day of September A.D. 1849. Signed, sealed and declared by the said John Joyner to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who at his request & in his presence subscribe our names as witnesses.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Sally Kirby one young cow called the horned heifer.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Frederick Kirby small bull yearling and my will and desire is that my executors herein after named do sell all my property both real and personal that is not above named in this my last will and testament and pay my funeral expenses together with my just debts and after paying my just debts my will is that the balance of the proceeds of my estate to be equally divided between all my children except Amos namely Erasmus, Amilly, Dieron, Patience, Sally, Frederick, Anna and Pitts and I hereby make and appoint my worthy friend Stanley Kirby my executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said Jesse Kirby Sr have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above written, signed sealed and published in the presence of us witnesses
