Will of Malichia Hinton

In the name of God Amen I Malichia Hinton of Johnston County being of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God, do therefore this twentieth day of March one thousand eight hundred and seven make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say

- Item I give and bequeath unto my son George Hinton three negro slaves named Dick, Stephen, Young Rachel with all his household furniture and stock of all sorts to him and his heirs forever
- Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Pharah Winkler two negro slaves named Jude and old Rachel and their increase one mare and saddle and bridle with all her stock of all sort and household goods to her and her heirs forever.
- Item I give and bequeath to my son Jacob Hinton two negroes slaves named Sam and Cirt.
- Item I leave in my will for George Hinton to give Jacob Hinton one hundred and fifty dollars to him and his heirs forever also to Jacob Hinton one feather bed one ^{new} saddle and bridle with all his stock of all sorts to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Vinson two negro slaves named Hammer and Peace and their increase one feather bed,stead and furniture one mare bridle and saddle her household furniture and stocks of all kind to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Bayan four negro slaves named Kose, Beck, Lary and Jim and their increase one feather bed and bedstead and furniture one walnut chest one saddle and bridle three cows and calves to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Hardy the land and plantation whereon I now live with three negro slaves named Toby, Moll and Patt and their increase one horse, bridle and saddle one feather bed, and furniture and household furniture and stock of all sorts to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Malichia Hinton for a certain tract or parcel of land lying on the east side of the sound pond beginning at the mouth of said sound pond branch from thence up the meanders of the said branch to the head from thence by a line of marked trees to the second back line from thence with said line to the old cart path from thence by a line of marked trees nearly north to the back line all and singular on the east side of said branch thence of with three negro slaves named Peter, Patience and Penny and their increase one feather bed and bedstead and furniture one new painted chest with his stock of all sorts to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Hinton the remainder of my land and plantation whereon I now live with three negro slaves named Moad, Lottice and Dove and their increase with one feather bed, bedstead and furniture and one new painted chest with his stocks of all sort to him and his heirs forever. I also give to my two daughters Elizabeth Vinson and Sarah Bayan one negro girl Looce and her increase to be equally divided between them to them and their heirs forever after my decease. I also give unto my son Jacob Hinton one horse called Mourntown to him and his heirs and assigns forever after my death, also old Sam, Harry and Pomp after my decease to be equally divided between Hardy Hinton, Malichia Hinton and William Hinton to them and their heirs forever also the remainder of my stock household furniture to be equally divided between my eight children

five sons and three daughters all my all my plantation working
tools and crop to be equally divided between my eight children
also after my decease I give the blacksmith tools to my son
Nealichia Hinton Jr to him and his heirs forever I do hereby
constitute and appoint William Hinton, Hardy Hinton Nealichia
Hinton executors to this my last will and testament in
witness hereof I the said Nealichia Hinton hath hereunto
set my hand and seal and declare in presence
of G. Wimberly)

Will of Leroy Brannan

In the name of God Amen I Leroy Brannan of Johnston County
and State of North Carolina being in my perfect senses and
memory but weak in body and calling to mind the uncertainty
of life and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to
die do make this my last will and testament first recommending
my soul to God who gave it and my body to the ground from
whence it was taken to be buried in a decent manner after
the burial of a christian at the discretion of my friends
then I bestow my estate in the following manner viz:

First I lend unto my beloved wife Rebekah Brannan the land
and plantation whereon I now dwell during her natural life
or widowhood and at her death or marriage then I give and
bequeath unto my beloved sons Thomas Brannan, John Brannan
James Brannan Leroy Brannan and Solomon Brannan the
same lands to be equally divided between my five sons above
named I give and bequeath unto my two beloved
daughters Elizabeth Brannan Cathach Brannan one feather bed
and furniture to each. Lastly I leave all the balance of my
estate to be sold and all the money arising therefrom collected
and my just debts be paid and if any money left to be equally
divided between my beloved wife Rebekah Brannan and my seven
children Thomas Brannan John Brannan James Brannan Leroy
Brannan and Solomon Brannan, Elizabeth Brannan and Cathach
Brannan and I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved
friends Nealichia Hinton and William Hinton as executors to
my last will. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal this 10th day of March in the year
of our Lord A. D. 1808.
