

Will of Mary Garner.

In the name of God Amen, I Mary Garner of Johnston County of North Carolina, being sick but in perfect sense and memory thanks be to God, for the same and calling to mind the mortality of mankind, that all is borned to die therefore of my worldly goods which it hath been pleased God to bestow upon me I give and bestow as follows, first I commit my soul unto hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my executors and all my worldly debts to be paid and the remnant of my estate I give as follows,

I give unto my beloved son Moses Garner one ^{year old} mare colt I also give unto my beloved son Stephen Garner one two year old mare colt and all my geese I give to my beloved daughter Sally Garner, also I give unto my beloved son Asa Garner one feather bed and furniture.

I give unto my beloved daughter Lizzy Garner one feather bed and furniture.

I give unto my beloved son Levey Garner one sound mare and seven two year old hogs and I also leave all my crop of all sort that's growing to all my children that is now living with me and the remainder of my property to be sold and equally divided amongst the whole of my children and I also constitute and appoint my sons Levey Garner and Moses Garner to be my executors and I do hereby disannull all former wills and testaments whatsoever. I do acknowledge this to be my last will and testament in witness my hand and seal the 27th day of August 1823.
