In the name of God Amen I Mary Gurley of the State and county aforesaid being weak in body but in sound mind and memory thanks be to God for it first my will and desire is for my body to be buried in a decent and Christian manner by my executors hereafter mentioned further my desire is that all my lawful debts be paid

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved son William Gurley one shilling sterling.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob Gurley one shilling sterling.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Tom Gurley one shilling sterling.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Austin one shilling sterling.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lydia Pool one shilling sterling.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Mary Burkitt one shilling sterling.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved son John Gurley one shilling sterling.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Polly Gurley all the remainder of my estate and property belonging to me further I ordain my daughter Polly Gurley my sole and only sole executor and if any of my estate to be sold by executor and not by the sheriff I ordain this my own last will and testament overlooking all other wills as witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 7th day of May anno 1791 in the presence of us test.

Will of John Morris

In the name of God Amen John Morris son of Johnstan County being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God for the same do this third day of October in the year of our Lord 1792 do make and publish this to be my last will and testament in manner following that is to say.

I give and bequeath unto Amy Hobby my daughter one feather bed and furniture.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Moore all the gear that belong to me and all the feathers on hands not already in beds also one third part of the crop now growing and now in hand with a axe and a broad hoe and a plow hoe and cutter plow hoe and one iron pot and one horn and gear.

Item I give and bequeath unto my grandson William Morris son of Nathan Morris a certain parcel of land lying on the east side of Carways branch beginning in Theophilus Hunter line at the run of said branch thence running on said Hunter line and Nathan Morris line to the main ~~run~~ run of said branch thence down the various courses of said Carways branch to the first station containing forty acres more or less to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my son Nathan Morris all my lands and plantation whereon I now dwell containing 600 acres with my brandy still kettle and cask and worm keg with all the liquor and casks to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Charlotte Moore one cow and calf.

Item I order and bequeath all the rest of my estate to be sold and the money raised to be equally divided between my children hereafter named to wife or their heirs to wit James Morris, Amy Hobby, John Morris, Mary Smith heirs Elizabeth Woods heirs, Sarah Rogers heirs, Nathan Morris heirs, Nabor Morris, & Annie Marshall &c and I do hereby make and ordain any beloved son John Morris and Nabor Morris executing to my last will and testament. In witness whereof to the said John Morris have to this my last
