not above mentioned I desire should be equally divided amongst
all children that is living at the time
And I do hereby constitute and appoint my truly friends
Henry Sasser and my son Stephen Watson executors to this
my last will and testament hereby revoking disannulling and
making void all former will and requests by me made and
declaring this only to be my last will and testament in
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal

Jacob Odum the sum of two dollars in money to him
and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my loving sister Mary Parker
the sum of two dollars in money to her and her
heirs forever

I give and bequeath unto the heirs of my loving sister
Lucilla Watson the sum of two dollars in money to
them and their heirs forever

I give and bequeath unto my worthy friend Jessie Sillivant
one feather bed bedstead and furniture to them and his
heirs forever.

All the rest and residue of my (property) estate of
whatsoever nature or kind I leave to be sold and the
money arising from the sale thereof to be applied to
the payment of my the legacies aforesaid named and the
residue if any to go to James Odum his heirs, assigns forever

In the name of God Amen I John Harrison of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory blessed be God for the same do this twenty seventh day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one make and ordain and publish this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following (that is to say)

Item It is my will and desire that all my just debts should be paid and such part of my perishable property sold for that purpose as can best and most conveniently be spared to be at the discretion of my executors herein after to be named and after selling such part of said property as can well be spared so as to leave my family a reasonable part or share to live on. Item I lend all the rest of my property both real and perishable unto my beloved wife Delila Harrison during her natural life or until my son Zachariah Harrison shall arrive to the age of twenty one years and at her death or if she should live until Zachariah arrives to the age of twenty one then I wish

the whole of said property which may not be consumed in raising of my family and supporting them to be sold and an equal division made amongst my wife and children equally only if my wife can find that it can well be spared I should be glad that as my children arrives to the age of twenty one or many that she should give them a bed & furniture each and a cow and calf. And I do hereby make and ordain my son James Harrison and my friend Bud Youngblood my executors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day & date above written.
