Will of Needham Taltor

In the name of God Amen I Needham Taltor being very sick and weak in health of body but of perfect sound sense and memory thanks be to God for the same and calling to mind the mortality of mankind knowing that all men are bound to die I do therefore make this my last will and testament and of all my worldly goods which it hath pleased the Almighty God his great mercy to bestow upon me I give and bequeath in the manner following first of all I commit my soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it and my body to be buried in a decent manner and after all my worldly debts are paid I give the remainder as followeth viz;

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Taltor one bed, stead and furniture the one that she brought here and one trunk one pair cotton cards to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved father and mother my beloved son Asa Taltor until he is free by the age of twenty years by their giving learning, and all the remaining part of my household goods and chattles that is not above mentioned to be sold after my debts are paid the balance to be put out on interest until my children becomes of age and then to be equally divided between them and I do hereby appoint my beloved father William Taltor and Cullen Taltor my executors and I do hereby disannull all manner of former wills whatsoever and I do acknowledge this only to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of March 1814 in presence of us
