Sis 17th day of September 1832 I John Williams of John
and state of both Carolina being of sound mind and
memory do make this my last will and testament
in the name of God Amen.
I wish all my just debts to be paid out of my estate

I give unto my beloved wife Amy Williams one grey horse
and all my stock of cattle except one work steer all my
household and kitchen furniture and two sides of leather
now in tan two plow hoes one axe and one slaves tub and
one weeding hoe and all the cow fodder and stacks of blades
and four barrels of corn and two hundred pounds of seed
cotton and three hogs a year and half old and all the provision
now on hand and half of the potatoes

Further for all my lands to be sold at public auction
and the balance of my estate except what I have given to
my wife

I give unto my daughters Patsy and Jemima as children
two hundred dollars to be equally divided among them
out of my estate the balance if any to be equally divided
among all my children. My land to be sold at public sale
except my grave yard.

I do hereby appoint John Leach as my executor to this my
last will in the presence of John Williams & mark
as the day and date above written

Will of Noah Barefoot Sr

In the name of God Amen I Noah Barefoot Sr of the
County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being in
perfect mind and memory and knowing that it is
appointed for all men once to die to make and declare
this to be my last will and testament in manner
and form following it is my will and desire that
all my just debts and funeral expenses be discharged
as quick as possible out of the most perishable property
of my estate by my executor herein after named.

First I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife of my
boxom Roxanna Barefoot the plantation whereon I now
live one big chist and all the kitchen furniture and
two feather beds and furniture and all the meat and
salt and all the corn or peas and all the blade fodder
and two cows and their young and one two year old
heifer and all the oat hogs one axe and one hoe to be hers
to do with as she pleases with at her decease the plantation
where I now live I give and bequeath unto my well
beloved son Mils Barefoot at his decease one horse bridle
and saddle one east and wheels and all the money that
he Mils Barefoot owes to his father Noah Barefoot Sr
one new hat and great coat and all my wearing clothes
and all my unmentionable property to be sold and equally
divided among all the rest of my lawful heirs to have
I affoint my son Mils Barefoot my executor of this
my last will and testament and hereby revoke all former
and wills by me made in witness whereof I have here
unto set my hand and seal this 4th day January 1833
