I do lend unto my beloved wife Betsy during her natural life one negro woman named Charney one feather bed bedstead and furniture and after also after paying my just debts out of the property which she thinks she can best spare I do lend unto my beloved wife during her natural life or widowhood both land and personal property and if the my beloved wife should die or marry before my son Alvin comes of age it is my desire that my negro should be hired out and the other property be sold and the money equally divided between my six children Reinmant, Anna, Alvin, Polly Miller and Zadock also my lands to be rented and the profits thereof divided in the same manner as the moneys of my other property among my other children.

I do hereby revoke and make void all other wills heretofore and acknowledge this to be my last will and desire.

I also do affiant and constitute Jonah Holder my executor to execute this my last will and testament Signed sealed and acknowledged in presence of us the 26 day of Sept in the year of our Lord 1824.
