

*Will of Reuben Perry*

In the name of God Amen I Reuben Perry of Johnston County and the State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this 18<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say

Item I give and bequeath unto my Elizabeth Perry one negro woman by the name of Courtney and all my land and tenements including the one hundred and fifty acres of land which I bought of Isaac Hinkie less on which I now live and have given said lands in due of gift to my son Godwin.

I also give unto my wife Elizabeth one horse and saddle two cows and calves and her third of the perishable property and household property during of her life and widowhood. I also give unto my wife Elizabeth one bed and furniture.

Item I also give unto my two sons Rigoon Perry also Godwin the remains of my lands and tenements setting aside the land and tenements on which I now live which I have given to my beloved son Reuben Godwin including and my household and perishable property the whole to be equally divided between my two sons Reuben Perry and Ale Godwin including the negro woman Courtney after my wife Elizabeth death or widowhood including Courtneys increase should she have any to go to my two beloved sons Rigoon Perry and Ale Godwin and I do hereby make and ordain my worthy friends Jesse Hall and William Wilbourn executors of this my last will and testament. In witness I the said Reuben Perry have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written. Signed sealed published and declared by the said Reuben Perry the testator as his last will and testament in the presence of us who were present at the signing and sealing thereof.

*Will of John Carroll*

In the name of God Amen I John Carroll of the County of Johnston in the State of North Carolina being in a low state of health but of sound and disposing mind and memory for which I am truly thankful to the great and wise disposer of all events do make and ordain this my last will and testament as follows (to wit)

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Sally Carroll wife of Mitchell Carroll fifty five dollars in cash.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Lucy Carroll wife of William Carroll fifty five dollars in cash one feather bed and one woman's saddle.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Delilah House wife of Warren House one negro boy named Salisbury now in their possession to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath my daughter Susanna Griffith wife of Urban Griffith one negro girl named Albia now in their possession to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Winifred Johnson wife of Willis Johnson one negro boy named Hardy now in their possession to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Benjamin Carroll one negro girl named Laney now in his possession to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Matthew Carroll two hundred acres of land lying in said County on the waters of Middle Creek to be taken off the southern part of a tract of land I purchased of Jonathan Austin one negro boy by the name of Frank one bay filly my new saddle to him his heirs and assigns forever, also one feather bed bedstead and furniture.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Mersill Carroll two hundred ~~acres~~ and twenty five acres of land being the remain part of the aforesaid tract by me purchased of said Jonathan Austin and out of which I have given to my son Matthew Carroll two hundred acres two negro boys named Joe and Abram
