I Robert Burck being sick and my weak but thanks be to God of good and perfect memory do bequeath my soul to Almighty God that govern me and my body to be buried after the discretion of my Executors and after my funeral expenses discharged and debts paid I bequeath my estate as followeth:

I give and bequeath to my beloved Mary one grey mare and saddle to her and her heirs forever and also I do lend to my wife one feather bed & furniture and also one grey wheel and also all my household furniture

I give and bequeath to my son Landon Burck one roan horse with grey mane & tail branded thus "R" on the shoulder also one saddle to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my daughter Leanneth Burck one feather bed and furniture one having wheel the sum of my wheels to her and her heirs forever.

I do hereby give all the remainder of my estate to my beloved wife Mary also I do appoint my son Landon Burck and my beloved wife Mary my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament as witnesses my hand and seal this 29th day of August

Will of Robert Lee

In the name of God Amen. I Robert Lee of the State of Georgia being very weak but of perfect mind and memory thanks be unto God for it and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die and as touching such worldly estate as has been please God to give me in this life I give and devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form following, Viz.

I give to my well beloved son Godfrey Lee one negro woman named Hannah and her two youngest children one girl named Fran and one boy named Page and all my lands. I also give to my grand daughter Sarah Lee daughter of my son Lewis Lee one negro girl named Fanning, and my grand son Benjamin Lee one negro lad named Buck with their equal share of all movable effects and their negroes to left with my executors until they come of age the executors for the work of said negroes to give their owners education.

The boy to be perfectly learned the use of three, the girl to read and write perfectly. I also give to my daughter Sarah Peoples one negro man named Cosser and one negro girl named Violet with her equal share of my movable effects I also lend to my daughter Winifred Blackman her life time one negro girl named Wagon and after her death to belong to my granddaughter Gilpha Blackman and the increase of said Wagon to be divided amongst the heirs of the body of said Winifred Blackman until they all get one with and equal part of all my movable effects.

I also give to my well beloved wife Elizabeth one grey gelden and one feather bed, and furniture. I constitute and appoint Henry Peoples, Godfrey Lee, and George Roberson to be my sole executors of this my last will and testament confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 28th of October 1782. signed, sealed, published, and proven. Delivered by the said Robert Lee as his last will and testament in the presence of us who in his presence and the presence of each other have here unto subscribed our names.

Will of Edward Price
