

Will of Sally Eason,

In the name of God Amen, I Sally Eason of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being sick and weak of body but of sound mind and understanding and knowing that I have to die do this day make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following (to wit)

1st-

I give and bequeath to my beloved brother Sanders Eason all my share of the tract of land whereon I and another and sisters and brother now lives containing two hundred and fifty acres also three head of cattle also one feather bedstead and furniture one wooden chest-

Secondly I make and ordain my said brother Sanders Eason my executor to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 22nd day of January 1839 Signed sealed published and declared in the presence of us the subscribers Witnesses

In the name of God Amen I Zilpha Gully of the state of North Carolina Johnston County being sound & perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this 27th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following viz

First-

I give and bequeath to my son Elias Barnes one bed, stead and furniture one cow and calf

Item

I also ^{give &} bequeath to my son Robert-Murphy Gully all my crop that is now on hand one small table one bed bedstead and furniture one clock and case and one work oxen to work with him.

Item

I give to my daughter Zilpha Wall one bed bedstead and furniture one cow and calf one small table one sugar tub and three sitting chairs three head of hogs and all my gase and all the balance of my property to be equally divided among my children that is Elizabeth Phillips, Sally Phillips, Robert M. Gully, Zilpha Wall and George S. Gully. And I do hereby make and ordain my son Robert M. Gully executor to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above written. Signed sealed and published by the said Zilpha Gully as her last will and testament in the presence of us who were present at the signing and publishing the same
