In the name of God Amen I Sally Masfern of the County of Johnston
and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of perfect mind &
memory do make publish and ordain this my last will and testament in
manner and form following

- 1st I give unto Daniel Ballance one feather bed and furniture
2nd I give to Amy Ballance one side saddle I give her one chest
3rd I give all my money unto Edmund Ballance's children and Sister Mary
to be equally divided
4th I give unto Amey Ballance one wooden wheel
5th I give unto Sister Masfern one iron axle or linen wheel also slays
6th and harness.
7th I give unto Hatch-Ballance one umbrella
8th I give unto Caly-Ballance one tub and one pail
9th I give unto Martha Pittman fifty cents
9th I give unto Mourning Ricks fifty cents
Last^{ly} I nominate and appoint Edmund Ballance executor of this my last
will and testament this the 11th day of April 1842 signed sealed

Will of Selia Mozengro

In the name of God Amen I Selia Mozengro being of sound mind
and memory but low in bodily afflictions do constitute and declare this
to be my last will and testament in words following (to wit)

- 1st It is my will that all my just debts be paid
2nd I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Waters ten dollars out of what
Asa Waters owes me for the hire of negro woman Zib
3rd I give to the children of my daughter Penelope Creek ten dollars
to be equally divided between them
4th I give to my son Joshua House ten dollars
5th I give to my daughter Cecile Harrison ten dollars
6th I leave ten dollars to be divided between the children of my daughter
Mary Waters deceased
7th I lend to my daughter Susan Cannady the following negro during
her life time (to wit) Clazy, Mary and Eliza and their increase and
at the time of my daughter's death (Susan Cannady) I give the said negroes
and their increase to be equally divided amongst the children of my
said daughter Susan Cannady.
8th I leave my negro woman Zib to be sold on a credit of six months
And I do hereby revoke annul and make void all other wills or wills
made heretofore by me and I do constitute and declare this to be my
last will and testament
9th I appoint Joshua Cannady executor of this my last-will and testa-
ment In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this 23rd day of July 1842
