

Will of Samuel Strickland

I Samuel Strickland of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say:

That - my executor (herein after named) shall provide for my body & suitable to the wife of my relatives and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with all my just debts however and to whosoever owing out of the moneys that may just come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item^{1st} I give and devise to my son Joseph Strickland all the law that I may be in possession of at my death to have and to hold to him and his heirs in fee simple forever.

Item^{2nd} My will and devise is that - all the residue of my estate if any after taking out the devices and legacies above mentioned shall be sold and the debts owing to me collected and if there should be any surplus over and above the payment of debts and expenses that such surplus shall be equally divided and paid over to my four daughters to wit, Dolly Oliver, Elizabeth Strickland, Martha Phillips and Edith Messer in equal proportions share and share alike to them and each and every one of them their executors administrators and assigns absolutely forever.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty son Joseph Strickland my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same & every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I the said Samuel Strickland do hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th day of August A.D. 1858. Signed sealed published and declared by the said Samuel Strickland to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence do subscribe our names as witnesses thereto.
