Item I give to my daughter Sarah Smith one cow further I lend
 to her one hundred acres of land on White Oak swamp laid
 off for that purpose heretofore and two negro women Sarah
 and Man during her lifetime and then the said land
 and negros and their increase to be equally divided
 between her heirs & children forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Winnifred Woodall
 one cow further I lend her one hundred acres of land
 on White Oak swamp laid off heretofore for that purpose
 and two negros Peggy and Casey during her lifetime and
 then said land and negros to be divided equally between her
 children and the heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Cordilla Johnson
 one cow & further lend to her one negro woman called Kicy during her
 lifetime and then said negro woman and increase to be divided
 among her sisters and their heirs by her -

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Barnaby Ingram four negroes Pete
 Daniel, Lily and Jacob and will that he take a negro woman
 called Theba which is infirm and take good care of her support

 furniture and farming utensils sufficient for her use at the
 discretion of my executors during her lifetime. Intended before assign-
 the wood (kitchen)

Item I give to my daughter Sarah Smith one cow further I lend
 to her one hundred acres of land on White Oak swamp laid
 off for that purpose heretofore and two negro women Sarah
 and Man during her lifetime and then the said land
 and negros and then in case to be equally divided
 between her heirs & children forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Winnifred Woodall
 one cow further I lend her one hundred acres of land
 on White Oak swamp laid off heretofore for that purpose
 and two negros Peggy and Chazy during her lifetime and
 then said land and negros to be divided equally between her
 children and the heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Cordilla Johnson 1
 cow & further lend to her one negro woman called Nicy during her
 lifetime and then said negro woman and increase to be divided
 among her sisters and their heirs by him -

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Barnaby Ingram four negroes Peter
 Daniel, Lory and Jacob and will that he take a negro woman
 called Theba which is infirm and take good care of her support
 and treat her tenderly during her life and if she have any children

to be his right and property and further give him all the acres that lies below the cowbane so called containing about one hundred and twenty acres one tract on the river about one hundred acres joining the mistake below Col Collins plantation one tract lying on the south side of the great Juniper swamp joining Thomas Lee & John Reeves line one tract bought Allen S. Ballinger lying on both sides of said swamp one piece lying on the south side of said swamp beginning at a black jack corner of the tract bought of said Ballinger near a place of the swamp called the old school ford and direct to my cart ford a little below the beach island & all my piney woods land that lies on the north side of Hammer Creek and the said Juniper Swamp to him and his heirs forever except his wife Edith Ingram and she is to have no lawful right or claim in said species of property unless he causes advice to her and I further will that he pay my son Shadrack Ingram five hundred dollars.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Creech further I lend her two negro boys Frank & Martin during her lifetime then I give Martin to his daughter Susana and Frank to be equally divided between his son John, Anne and Sally and their heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Ambrose Ingram sixty acres of land lying on the south side of Hammer Creek between the Meadow branch joining Mr. Allens lands to him and heirs forever.

Item I lend to my grandson Henry Ingram two tracts of land containing one hundred acres each lying on the south side of Hammer Creek being on the road and head of Meadow branch joining Mr. Vinsons Mr. Allens, Mr. Hardy Lees lands and hundred acres below the spring branch joining Mr. Allens land and one tract of land on the south side of the Creek on said creek between the Valley branch and Meadow branch joining William Lee, Hardy Lee and the Allen lands some under one hundred acres in it and one negro boy named Sam two cows two sows said Henry Ingram is to take care of father & mother and to support their bodily needs as far as in his power their lifetime and to hold the aforesaid property his lifetime and if he does take care of his parents until support them as above prescribed and has issue said property shall be theirs and their heirs forever but if he dies without issue then it shall descend unto my daughter and their heirs forever after bodily support for his father & mother their lifetime if the said Henry Ingram should decess before they do.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Shadrack Ingram all my lands that lies in the fork of Hammer Creek the great Juniper Swamp is not mentioned in legacies above the five hundred dollars that my son Barnaby is to pay him and my shot gun to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Eliza Lee one cow ^{and} her heirs forever, further I lend unto her one hundred acres of land heretofore laid off for her near the white oak swamp one negro girl Rache one boy Sid and one called Henry during her lifetime and after her decess I will that the land and negroes and increase of the girl be divided between her children and their heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Creech one hundred and seven acres of land lying on the White Oak swamp joining the Lee lands one negro named Jane and one boy called Pompey to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susana Hobbs one negro woman Dicy and a boy called Ephraim to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Janna Creech one negro girl to her and her heirs forever.

If there be any thing remaining of my small property after my business is settled agreeable to my will that is disposed of I will that it be equally divided between my daughters above named and their heirs forever.

And I do hereby appoint and constitute my son Barnaby Ingram and Lewis Creech my executors of this my last will and testament ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourteenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven signed sealed published & declared
