

Will of Stephen Lee

In the name of God Amen I Stephen Lee of Johnston
and State of North Carolina being in a fair state of health by
of sound and disposing mind and memory blessed be God do make
publick and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner
and form following (to wit)

First- Off all I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body
be buried in a decent christian like manner at the discretion of
my surviving friends.

Item It is my will that my just debts all be paid and after
paying all my debt I do give the following property as follows
Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Lee, Winnifred Lee
Prizah Lee and Elizabeth Lee five hundred and ten acres of
land adjoining the lands of Nicholas Lee, Edward Lee and Henry Lee
to be equally divided amongst them all

Item 4 give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Lee one barrel-
Item often having 1 dish bacon & 12 doz Pewter plates to my son
Littleton Lee. I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Nancy
Lee, Winnipeg Lee Ritzieah Lee and Elizabeth Lee all the rest of my
Pewter ware.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Lee, William Lee & Little Lee and my daughter's Nancy Lee, Kizziah Lee & Elizabeth one each and all the rest of the fishing utensils to be made use of among them as heretofore.

I give and bequeath to my son Littleton Lee 1 mare and the
colt if it comes to live three choice cows and calves one tract
of land containing 250 acres adjoining the lands of Henry Lee &
R. W. Freed sole tract known by the name of the Hardy Lee place
after taking of a certain parcel to my son William Lee to com-
mence at Hardy Lee corner at a black jack and to run a north
course to my line also. I give to my son Littleton Lee my negro
man Isaac after my said son Littleton Lee becomes to the age of
thirty years I give to him ten head of sheep one dish 1 bacon
in his plate etc.

Item In dog plates &c
I give to all the rest of my children ten head of sheep
to each one of them the balance of my sheep (if any) to
be equally divided amongst my children.

I give all the remaining stock of cattle to be equally divided amongst all the balance of my children

I give to my son Littleton one shot gun
I give to my son William Lee one musket

Item 10 give to my wife Edith ten dollars in cash

I give to my son Littleton Lee one bed and furniture
I give to my daughter Nancy Lee one bed and furniture
I give to my daughter Winifred Lee one bed and furniture
I give to my daughter Elizabeth Lee one bed and furniture
I give to my son Littleton Lee my best riding saddle &
bridle and one large chest
I give to my son William Lee one case and bottles
I give to my son Samuel Lee one large jug and sythe
I give to my daughter Nancy Lee one loom and gear
I give to my son Samuel Lee one bed and furniture
I give to my son William Lee one bed and furniture
I give to my family that remains at my place of residence
all the kitchen furniture
I leave sixty dollars in cash to buy a horse for the family
remaining at my place of residence whenever he is needed
It is my will that the aforesaid negro man Isaac to
remain with the family at my place of residence until my son
Littleton becomes to the age aforesaid mentioned
It is my will that all of the residue of my property which
is not devolved in the foregoing items be sold on a credit
of six months by my executors hereafter to be appointed
and the money arising from the sale of the same to be
equally divided amongst surviving children after paying
out by my executors the sum of money to each one
named in the foregoing items out of the sales of my
property and I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons
Samuel Lee and William Lee as my executors to this
my last will and testament in witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this 23rd day of June
A.D. 1840. Signed sealed published and declared by
the said Stephen Lee as his last will and testament in
the presence of us who were
present at the sealing of the same
