

## Will of Thomas Branman

To all people to whom these present shall come know ye that I Thomas Branman of Johnston County State of North Carolina have for and in consideration of the love goodwill and affection I have for my beloved son Leroy Branman of said county and State do give and devise to him the said Leroy Branman and his heirs forever the land and plantation wherein I now live with all the houses improvements and & belonging to the same also one hundred acres of land lying on the waters of Belvoir branch I also give to my said son Leroy Branman all the casks that belong to my plantation also one large stone pitcher one cart and wheels and one ox yoke and cradle also all my carpenters, coopers, and shoemakers tools and also I give to my two granddaughters Elizabeth Branman and Catharine Branman daughters of my son Leroy Branman five pounds to be divided between my said grandchildren Elizabeth and Catharine Branman and also I give to my said son Leroy Branman one case and bottles also one slate also I give to my two sons William and Casper Branman all my wearing apparel to be equally divided between the two after being decently buried and all the balance of my personal property I leave to be sold and my just debts collected and paid. I constitute and appoint my two sons Leroy and Willie Branman my executors and after that all the money remaining collected and be equally divided between my six children leaving now Anne Youngblood, Thomas Branman Jr., Casper Branman, William Branman, La Letha Duck and Leroy Branman first reserving the use of my personal and real estate for and during the term of my natural life. In witness I the said Thomas Branman have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 30<sup>th</sup> day of August A.D. 1802.

## Will of William Heimant

In the name of God Amen I William Heimant of Johnston County and State of North Carolina being in perfect sense and memory tho weak in body and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and testament to be buried in a decent manner after the burial of a Christian. Then I beget my estate in the following manner viz; first I positively give and devise to my loving brother Gthm Heimant all my land and plantation wherein I now live also one negro woman Lucy and Willis also three head of horses and all my stock of cattle and hogs also all my house hold and kitchen furniture to him and his heirs forever. I do also give and devise to my sister Elizabeth Lee the sum of ten shillings to her and her heirs forever also I give to my other sister Mary Folk the sum of ten shillings to her and her heirs forever. I do also give and devise to my nephew Bryan Heimant one horse called by the name of Nosback and my saddle and bridle also I give to my brother Richard Heimant orphans John Heimant and James Heimant the sum of five shillings each to them and their heirs forever also I give to my niece Lucy Heimants child the sum of one shilling and my just debts paid and collected and the balance of the money if any remaining I give to my brother John Heimant and his heirs forever. I constitute and appoint my loving friends Matthew Wilder and George Gully executors to this my last will in witness whereof I have hereunto set and affixed my hand and seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord A.D. 1804.
