

## Will of William Jones.

In the name of God Amen I William Jones of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina do declare this is my last will and testament in the following to wit-

Item The first I leave to my wife Anna Jones all of the land and tenement-ways and means will and appertaining during her natural life also I lend unto the said Anna Jones of my hogs, horses, cattle, sheep & swine and geese during her natural life also I lend her the said Anna Jones all of my household & kitchen furniture com foddery cart and gear farming utensils and all and singular every other piece of property to her belonging after paying my just debts.

Item I leave to be equally divided among all my lawful children all of my property after the death of my wife it is my desire and I do appoint James Lessiter my executor to carry this my will in full in witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of June 1844

## Will of Thomas Eatman

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Eatman of the County being of sound mind and memory blessed be God do this the first day of October in the year of our Lord 1840 do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows that is to say,

First- I give and bequeath to my son Kitchen Eatman the sum of one dollar

I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Zilla Eatman one dollar.

I also give and bequeath unto my son John Eatman one dollar

I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Debby Bryan one dollar

I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Tolly Stog one dollar

I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Fesby Eatman five head of hogs two pots one catch oven one earthen dish one pewter bacon three pewter plates one table, one room & gear three bee hives one feather bed and furniture one woolen wheel and cards

I also give and bequeath to my daughter Cally Boykin one hundred acres of land lying on the south side of Contentry Creek reaching to the steep hill branch and five head of hogs one flat wheel and one bee hive

And I also give unto my daughter Tolly Eatman one hundred and seventy acres of land lying on the south side Morgan Creek namely the place wheron I now live during her life or marriage and then to my grandson Calvin Eatman.

I also give to Calvin Eatman one cart and wheels ten ciders caskes one blacksmith shop to the use of Calvin Eatman and John Boykin and I give to Calvin Eatman all my working tools three head of cattle.

I also leave my negro Peter to be equally divided between my two daughters Cally Boykin and Tolly Eatman and I also leave the ballance of my property to be sold to pay my just debts and if not sufficient that Tolly Eatman and Cally Boykin can pay the ballance out of their last and if any remains after paying my just debts the remains to be equally divided between Cally Boykin & Tolly Eatman and I make and ordain Henry H. Sett executor to this my last will and testament and I the said Thomas Eatman do to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and date above written signed sealed and acknowledged in the presence of us witnesses
