

Will of John Spencer

In the name of God Amen I John Spencer of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but weak in body and knowing I am to die so this day make and ordain this writing to be my last will and testament in manner and form following (to wit)

First I give and devise to my beloved and dear wife Polly Spencer the land and plantation wherein I now live containing three hundred and thirty acres during her natural life or as long as she liveth my widow. Also I give and devise to my said wife four negroes, Jason, Henry, Buck and Pleasant during her lifetime or as long as she remains my widow my will and devise further that my said wife Polly have as much of my crop stock and provision on hand as will be sufficient to support her and the family for 1 year and further I give to my said wife a mare and colt during his lifetime or as long as she lives my widow also I give to my said wife two cows & yearlings and two heifers also three sheep and pigs and eighteen day hogs etc three leather bedsstead and furniture with all the rest of household and kitchen furniture also 1 plow hoe frame and set two weeding hoes and grubbing hoe 2 club axes six during her lifetime or as long as she lives my widow any will and desire is that my land lying on Burnt Stocking containing a hundred and sixty six acres with my negro woman Tempy and her four children Linda, Fillas, Jannah and Jerry with all the residue of my property be sold and my just debts paid on the residue I give to my children Tabot, Harriet, Sally and James. Rufus Spencer share & share my will and devise is that my negro Susan be sold the money to be divided among my children to them and their heirs forever. I leave any friend Levy Coe my sole to this my last will and testament and I the said John Spencer revoke all other wills by me made and do hereby ratify and confirm this writing to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2 day Sept-1829

Will of Thomas Johnson

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Johnson of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina being weak of body but of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this 6<sup>th</sup> day of August 1827 make publish and declare this to be my last will and testament in form and manner following (to wit)

First I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body to be buried in a christian manner at the discretion of executors hereafter to be appointed

I lend to my beloved wife Anne two hundred and fifty seven acres of land (it being a tract or parcel of land which I purchased of Isaac Williams) during her lifetime or widowhood. It is my will and devise that my executors shall carry into effect a contract heretofore made myself and Gerald Johnson respecting the claim said Gerald in the undivided lands of which Moses Johnson deceased did possess of and that executors pay the Gerald the sum of thirty dollars account of my estate and take a title of the said Gerald & for and in behalf & to the ~~one~~ <sup>one</sup> of hers which is affected, is my will that it be disposed of the same manner of the ~~one~~ <sup>one</sup> hundred & fifty acres called the old tract wherein I now live which was left to my mother Lucy Johnson during her life

I lend to my beloved wife five hundred and ninety one acres of land including the plantation wherein I now live commonly called the old tract ~~undivided~~ land reserving herein the lifetime estate of Lucy Johnson widow of Moses Johnson decd to her during her lifetime or widowhood. I lend to my wife Anne all my stock of cattle during her lifetime or widowhood. I lend to my wife Anne one negro boy named Young her lifetime or widowhood. I lend to my wife Anne 1 pair of cart wheels during her lifetime or widowhood. I lend to my wife Anne all my farming utensils during her lifetime or widowhood.

I lend to my wife all my household & kitchen furniture during her lifetime or widowhood. I lend to my wife two hundred dollars during her lifetime or widowhood.

I lend to my beloved wife one negro man by the name of Henry during her lifetime or widowhood.

I lend to be sold at vendue one horse and saddle we give I lend my wife Anne all provision now on hand during her lifetime or widowhood. I lend to my wife all the fowls of every kind and one womans saddle during her lifetime or widowhood.

I lend to my wife all my books during her lifetime or widowhood, it is my will that my executors collect the money that is due me and at the same to settle all my just debts.

I lend to my wife all my property not particular enumerable above during her lifetime or widowhood. It is my will and desire should wife marry again that all the property lent her in the above be equally divided between my wife Anne and my three children namely Moses, A. Green and Edith to them and their heirs forever and in the event of her not marrying it is my will and desire that all the property left her in the above items be after her death equally divided between my three children namely as the above to them and their heirs forever. It is my will and desire that my executors use these executors to secure to Elijah Lassiter quit-lease of fifty acres of land off the old undivided 650 acre tract wherein I now live and that it be of joining the lands of said Elijah Lassiter it being the claim of Benjamin Johnston Jr. in the lands aforesaid which after taking off the 59 acres from the 650 will leave 591 which I have herein above left my wife Anne and I constitute my wife and my friend Jessie Adams as executors of this my last will and testament. Signed, sealed and published Declared by the testator as his last will & testament

### Will of John Bayly

In the name of God Amen April 20<sup>th</sup> one thousand eight hundred and thirty & John Bayly of Johnston County State of North Carolina being in reasonably good health thank God for his mercy I am in perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is once appointed for all men to die and I do therefore make and sign this my last will and testament that is to say first of all I give and bequeath my soul to God that gave it me and my body to the earth to receive it - hath pleased God to bless me with which I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form to wit -

I give to my daughter Tempery Bayly twelve dollars

I give to my daughter Elizabeth Bayly one hundred acres of land wherein I now live including the houses I give her one negro boy by name Abram one bed and furniture one mare.

I give to my son Jessie Bayly all the balance of my land I give him one negro boy name Joseph, I give him one gun, I give him Twenty-five dollars, I give to Elizabeth Bayly Twenty-five dollars. I give to my daughter Nancy Cooper one negro woman by the name of Sally. I give to my daughter Lucy Neal one negro girl named Cottney. I give her twenty-five dollars

I give to my daughter Unity Rains two negroes named Kate and Laron I give her twenty-five dollars. I give her Mafer twenty-five dollars. I give to Lucy Bayly one cold All the balance of my property I leave to be sold my stock of all kind household & kitchen furniture money & notes which I have not given away all the balance to be equally divided among all my children. I also consider and appoint my son Jessie Bayly executors of my last will and testament. Revoking and disallowing all other wills satisfying and confirming this and none other to be my last will and testament in conformation hereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the day and year above written assigned
